

# Blue Jays cross country teams take first, second at Wamago meet last Saturday

After winning the championships of their own Norton Invitational to start the 2010 season, the Norton Community High School girls and boys cross country teams traveled to Wamego on Saturday and placed first and second, respectively, in the toughest meet in which they will compete this season!

**GIRLS**

“This was a fantastic day for our girls,” said Norton head coach George Rossi. Four of the top ten teams in Class 3A and two ranked teams from Classes 1A and 2A were competing. Riley County is the defending state champion in 3A and is ranked No.1 in the state.

“Every one of our girls ran with maximum effort today. Astrid Moen did a great job placing behind Heather Ruder from Thomas More Prep-Marian of Hays and Katelyn Henderson from Olpe. Both were state runners-up in cross country in 2009.

“The great thing about today is the fact the rest of our top five runners were within a minute and thirty seconds of Astrid and our entire team was within two minutes of each other.

“Every girl also had a faster time on the Wamego course than they did at the Norton meet. Abby Bainter, Kamilla Jones, Julia Kent and Dustyna Sprigg also improved their time from a year ago in the Wamego meet.

“We want to continue to improve. Wamego is always a great meet to see how we stack up against quality teams from all parts of the state. While we are very happy with our results, we

must now focus on Hays next. At Hays, we will compete again against TMP and also Colby and Ness City, both of which have outstanding girls teams.”

Riley County won the Wamego championship last season with 80 points and Norton placed runner-up with 88 points. This time around, Norton scored 79 points and Riley County tallied 88 points for second.

Overland Park Prep was third with 107, followed by Southeast of Saline, 137; Winchester-Jefferson County, 140; Thomas More Prep, 149; Kaw Valley, 173; Northern Heights, 205; Sabetha, 212 and Olpe, 222, in the top ten.

Junior Astrid Moen led the way for Norton with a third place finish individually in 17:05.

Freshman Darcy Bainter was 13th in 17:48, followed by freshman Katelyn Engelbert, 23rd, 18:17; sophomore Kamilla Jones, 26th, 18:25 and sophomore Julia Kent, 33rd, 18:42.44 to complete the five team members’ times.

Also running for the Lady Jays and their places and times were: junior Abby Bainter, 34th, 18:42.46 and senior Dustyna Sprigg, 47th, 19:12.

There were 107 runners in the girls race and the top 40 places medaled.

The top ten runners in the girls race were: Heather Ruder, Thomas More Prep, 15:56.36, first; Katelyn Henderson, Olpe, 16:59.71, second; Astrid Moen, Norton, 17:05.39, third; Karly Ruggle, Riley County, 17:09.23, fourth; Mindy Wilson, Kaw Valley, 17:12.27, fifth; Courtney Freed, Scandia-Pike Valley, 17:13.32, sixth; Brooklyn Meinke, Overland Park, 17:17.07, seventh;

Allison Pfeifer, Thomas More Prep, 17:19.38, eighth; Maria Fernandez, Burrton, 17:28.10, ninth; Mallory Kramer, Winchester-Jefferson County, 17:41.24, tenth.

**BOYS**

“When our Blue Jay boys took the course they also ran a fantastic race,” said coach Rossi. “Zach Hartwell had a tremendous kick to make up about 30 yards with 150 yards to go to catch and pass another competitor for third place.

“Troy Bainter, John Renner and Kegan Vanover also improved their times compared to the 2009 Wamego race. Freshmen Marc Miller and Alec Hager also ran great times for their taste of the tough Wamego course.

“Junior Bryan Henry also bettered his time from last week by about 30 seconds.

“Just like the girls, the boys are happy with their results but we also found several areas that need improvement. This meet is a great tool to point out strength and weakness among each runner. Our boys need to continue to work with passion and take advantage of every minute of practice in order to achieve the goals not only for themselves but for their team as well.”

Overland Park Christian Prep won the boys championship with 45 points, followed by Norton, 85; Holcomb, 108; Wellsville, 115; Pretty Prairie, 164; Winchester-Jefferson County, 166; Southeast of Saline, 235; St. George-Rock Creek, 239; Scandia-Pike Valley, 244; Alma-Wabunsee, 246, in the top ten.

Junior Zach Hartwell led the Norton boys with a third place finish in 18:02, followed by senior Troy Bainter, 19th, 19:12; fresh-

man Marc Miller, 23rd, 19:25; freshman Alec Hager, 27th, 19:31 and junior Bryan Henry, 37th, 19:52, to complete Norton’s five-man team placings.

Other Norton runners and their placing and times were: sophomore John Renner, 38th, 19:53 and senior Kegan Vanover, 52nd, 20:31.

The top ten individual runners were: Joel Allen, Hillsboro, 16:59.50, first; Isaac Williams, Pretty Prairie, 17:52.36, second; Zach Hartwell, Norton, 18:02.61, third; Colby Nuessen, Olpe, 18:03.36, fourth; Paul Goldsmith, Overland Park, 18:20.94, fifth; Kenneth Froebe, Overland Park, 18:26.30, sixth; Brendan Thomas, Holcomb, 18:27.95, seventh; Cole Meyer, Wellsville, 18:28.88, eighth; Joshua Gillett, Overland Park, 18:34.31, ninth; Dallas Edwards, Winchester-Jefferson County, 18:44.53, tenth.

There were 125 runners in the boys race and 40 medaled.

## Next action

The Norton girls and boys cross country runners will have another good test when they compete in the Hays Invitational on Thursday in Hays with starting time set for 3:45 p.m.

Teams competing, in addition to Norton and Hays High, will be Colby, Dodge City, Garden City, Great Bend, Junction City, Liberal, Ness City, Plainville, Salina Central, Salina South, Stockton and Thomas More Prep-Marian.

The junior varsity girls race will begin at 3:45 p.m., followed by the junior varsity boys, 4:15; varsity girls, 4:45 and varsity boys, 5:15.
