From the opening tipoff, there

was no doubt who would win. Norton held quarter leads of 16-2, 31-16 and 52-23.

Sophomore point guard Tawni Griffey led Norton scoring in the first quarter with a three and a two point basket. Senior Dustyna Sprigg hit two baskets, senior Kaylen Rossi buried a threepointer and junior Erin Terrell gave a hint of things to come with a basket and two free throws.

Meanwhile, the Lady Jay defense was relentless, allowing only one field goal.

Terrell hit three baskets, Griffey repeated her first quarter performance with a double and triple basket and Sprigg and sophomore Kamilla Jones each hit a basket in the 15-point second period.

Oberlin was able to score 14 points in the second quarter but still trailed Norton by 15 points.

Terrell was unstoppable in the third period, hitting four baskets and three of four charity tosses in the best scoring quarter for the Lady Jays as they added 21 more points to their total. They limited advantage to 29 points.

Junior Caren Thomson had a good third quarter, hitting three baskets. Sprigg and Griffey each added a bucket.

Terrell did all the scoring for Norton in the fourth period as she hit three more baskets and a free throw. Oberlin scored12 points but it was too little, too late.

The fourth quarter was shortened by the continuous scoreboard clock when the Lady Jays' lead reached 30 points.

"I'm really pleased; we played hard," said Norton head coach Kevin Jilka.

"We put in a lot of hard work during the Christmas break.

"Our biggest improvement was on defense. All night we played good defense. We had great help and rotation on the defensive

"Our offense executed really well, too, and we had nice balance offensively. We really got on the offensive boards.

"Some of our former players were home from college and we practiced against them. They made us work harder and it showed tonight.

"I hope we can bottle this and keep going when we play Friday at Osborne. They have a great tradition and that's a tough place to play."

Norton is now 3-3 for the season and Osborne is 3-4.

Terrell ended with a career high 28 points on 11 of 15 shots from two-point range for a net smoking 73 percent accuracy and an equally accurate 6 of 7 from the Oberlin to 7 and extended their free throw line for 86 percent!

Griffey finished with 12 points on 2 of 3 from long range for 67 percent, 3 of 5 two-point tries for 60 percent and 5 of 8 overall for 63 percent.

Kiah Blau led Oberlin in scoring with 14 points.

As a team, Norton hit 3 of 11 from beyond the arc for 27 percent, 22 of 42 two-point tries for 52 percent and 25 of 53 overall for 47 percent.

Oberlin swished 4 of 11 long range shots for 36 percent, 9 of 22 two-pointers for 41 percent and 13 of 33 overall for 39 percent.

Terrell was the only Norton player to shoot any free throws. Oberlin hit 5 of 7 charities for 71

The Lady Jays pulled down 16 offensive and 13 defensive rebounds for 29 total compared to 12 offensive and 6 defensive and 18 total for Oberlin.

Terrell grabbed 10 caroms, followed by Griffey, Sprigg, 5 each; Thomson, 4; Katelyn Engelbert, 3; Kaylen Rossi, 2.

The Lady Jays had 14 steals compared to just 3 thefts for the Lady Red Devils. Sprigg was the leader with 5, followed by Terrell, 4; Griffey, Rossi, 2 each; Thomson, 1.




