

JV golf team wins third championship

The Norton Community High School junior varsity golf team won their third straight team championship on Tuesday when they successfully defended their home turf in the Norton JV Invitational Golf Tournament played on the Prairie Dog Recreation Association course south of Norton.

Not only did Norton win the championship but the Norton B team placed runner-up.

Norton tallied a 187 to win the title and the Norton B carded a 203. Third place went to Phillipsburg, 208; followed by Colby, 220; Norton C, 226; Plainville, 235; Smith Center, 235.

Norton freshman Marc Miller shot a 42 which made him No. 1 medalist for the tournament. Other members of the Norton championship foursome and their scores were: sophomore Treven Rossi, 47; junior Taylor Meder, 48; sophomore Cassius Dole, 50.

Also playing with the first team were senior Nikki McVey, 52 and senior Ashley Millan, 53.

The Norton B team members and scores were: sophomore Dustan Daniels, 46; sophomore Ryan Bainter, 50; sophomore Javen Colip, 53; senior Josh Asbury, 54.

Also playing with the Norton C team was sophomore Jamie Harshbarger, who shot a 71.

ORDINANCE NO. 118-11

An Ordinance amending Ordinance #118 relating to the accumulation and disposal of rubbish, trash, ashes and combustible material and providing penalties for the violation thereof.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Norcat, Kansas:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to allow to accumulate in any part of any building, or outside of and adjacent to any building or in any alley, sidewalk, street or premises within 30 feet of any building, any rubbish, trash, waste paper, excelsior, empty boxes or barrels.

SECTION 2. No person shall deposit or stack any hay or straw within 500 feet of any building located in the fire limits.

SECTION 3. Packing material shall be in metal or wood metal-lined bins having self-closing or automatic cover. Refuse from rooms where packing or unpacking is done shall be removed daily.

SECTION 4. It shall be unlawful to store ashes inside of any non-fireproof building unless they be stored in an incombustible container or receptacle, and a clearance of at least five feet shall be maintained between such container or receptacle and combustible material. Ashes shall not be stored outside of any buildings in wooden receptacles or dumped in contact with or in close proximity to any combustible material.

SECTION 5. It shall be unlawful to burn rubbish, trash, leaves, lumber, straw or other combustible material in any street, alley or vacant lot within the fire limits or within 25 feet of any building in the city of Norcat, Kansas, except in an approved garbage burner so constructed as to prevent escape of sparks or burning material.

SECTION 6. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined not less than fifty dollars (\$50) nor more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) for each offense.

SECTION 7. All ordinances or part of ordinances in conflict with the foregoing are hereby repealed.

SECTION 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper.
