**ORDINANCE NO. 118-11** 

disposal of rubbish, trash, ashes and combustible material and providing

**SECTION 1.** It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to allow to accumulate in any part of any building, or outside of and adjacent to any building or in any alley, sidewalk, street or premises within 30 feet of any building, any rubbish, trash, waste paper, excelsior, empty boxes or barrels.

SECTION 2. No person shall deposit or stack any hay or straw within 500 feet of any building located in the fire limits.

self-closing or automatic cover. Refuse from rooms where packing or unpacking is done shall be removed daily.

unless they be stored in an incombustible container or receptacle, and a clearance of at least five feet shall be maintained between such container or receptacle and combustible material. Ashes shall not be stored outside of any buildings in wooden receptacles or dumped in contact with or in close proximity to any combustible

combustible material in any street, alley or vacant lot within the fire limits or within 25 burner so constructed as to prevent escape of sparks or burning material.

SECTION 6. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined not less than fifty dollars (\$50) nor more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250)
