Norton's Zac Dreher was


scheduled to help the North as an assistant coach but assisted the South Team, since one of their coaches was absent due to a family emergency.

It was a hard-hitting, fun game for recently graduated senior football players from Kansas, Nebraska and Missouri.



The North kicked off to the South, held them and forced them to punt to the North 6-yard-line. North tailback Terrell Lane of Norton gained 48 yards on three carries to the South 46. From there, running back Terrence Allen from Junction City got loose for the first and only touchdown of the first quarter. Norton's Caleb Laughlin split the uprights for the point-after for a 7-0 lead with 2:27 left in the quarter.

The South answered early in the second quarter with a 40-yard touchdown pass from South Grey quarterback Garrison Hendricks to Omaha North receiver Larves Jones. The extra point kick was good and it was 7-7.

After the ensuing kickoff, the South held and forced the North to punt. They drove downfield and threatened to score but the tough North defense held them on their 3-yard-line!

Following the goal line stand, the North offense took over and moved down the field with two long first down runs. Norton's Spencer Shirk was at quarterback and lofted a pass to Raytown, Missouri product Trey Myers, who leaped to haulit in, then broke several tackles and headed to the end zone for a 68-yard touchdown! The extra point kick was wide but the North led 13-7 with 48.7 seconds left in the first half.

The South kicked off to start the second half and tried to get possession with an onside kick. Norton's Justin Griffith fought off the South players and aggressively recovered the pigskin on the North 34-yard-line. A few plays later, however, the South intercepted a North pass and returned the ball to the South 44yard-line.

The North defense held and the South punted out of bounds quarterback and Lane at tailback and several Blue Jay linemen such as McKenna, Keiswetter, Ninemire and Griffith leading the way, the North moved down

the field. Lane made several good runs and Shirk completed two passes. Lane ran the final six yards for another North touchdown. Laughlin booted the extra point to extend the North lead to 20-7 with 47 seconds left in the third

The South's Donnie Lockhart of Shawnee Heights High School broke free with a powerful 36yard touchdown run down the left sideline with 9:19 left in the contest. A good rush mostly by Norton defenders caused the South kicker to miss the extra point attempt, leaving the score

After the ensuing kickoff, with Lane carrying the mail most of the time, the North moved downfield again. Lane found the end zone for the second time in the game, this time on a sweep around right end from the 5-yard-line. Laughlin was accurate once again on the extra point kick and the North extended their lead to 27-13 with 6:43 remaining in the game.

The South didn't score their final touchdown until late in the game on a 29-yard pass from Hendricks to Jones. A try for two extra points failed and it was 27-19 with 3:18 remaining. The North offense played conservatively, retaining the ball until the final seconds when quarterback Shirk took a knee to end the game.

Terrell Lane was the leading ball carrier for both teams. He toted the pigskin 17 times for 111 yards and two touchdowns. Lane averaged 6.5 yards per carry.
