The Lady Jays' season highlights were their first place finish in the Plainville Invitational, runner-up in the Mid-Continent League Championships in Phillipsburg, runner-up in the Smith Center Redmen Relays, runnerup in the Norton Invitational and third place in the Phillipsburg Invitational.

The Norton girls other placings were: third, Smith Center JV; eighth, Goodland Freshmen/ Sophomore Meet; 13th, Trego Freshmen/Sophomore Meet; fourth, Goldsmith Relays in Wa-Keeney; fourth, Oberlin Invitational; sixth, Russell Relays; eighth, Hill City Invitational; fifth, Class 3A Regional Championships in Phillipsburg and 13th in the State Championships

The Norton boys team finished runner-up in the Oberlin Invitational, runner-up in the Smith Center JV Meet, third in the Plainville Invitational, third in the Phillipsburg Invitational and third in the Mid-Continent League Championships in Phil-

Other placings for the Norton boys were: fifth, Smith Center Redmen Relays; sixth, Norton Invitational; seventh, Goodland Freshmen/Sophomore Meet; tenth, Trego Freshman/Sophomore Meet; sixth, Russell Relays; seventh, Goldsmith Relays in WaKeeney; eighth, Hill City Invitational; seventh, Class 3A Regional Championships in Phillipsburg and 18th in the State Championships in Wichita.

High point performer for the Norton girls was sophomore Alec Melvin with 119 points and high point boys athlete was sophomore Jacob Brooks with 147.5 points.

Qualified for State Meet

Norton sophomores Teslee Nickell and Alec Melvin scored 26 points in field events in the Regional Track Meet in Phillipsburg. Nickell won the gold medal lin the shot put with a heave of 40'6.5".

Melvin qualified for the state meet in three events. Alec placed fourth in the shot put with a distance of 33'9.25"; third in the discus with a throw of 104'6" and third in the javelin with a personal best throw of 112'11".

Lady Jay junior Astrid Moen and freshman Darcy Bainter placed third and fourth, respectively, in the 3200 meter run and set personal records in the process to qualify for the state meet. Moen was timed in 12:31.60 and Bainter in 12:38.02.

Norton's 4 x 800 meter girls relay team of freshman Bailey Ambrosier, Moen, sophomore Kamilla Jones and senior Dustyna Sprigg placed fourth in a personal best 10:09.03, which also broke the Norton school record.

The previous record was set at the state meet in 2002 by Stef Sloan, Megan Walter, Callie Graber and Abbey Keiswetter with a time of 10:21.

The Norton girls 4 x 400 meter relay team also had a tremendous performance, placing third in the regional meet with a personal record clocking of 4:12.06. Running on that foursome were junior Erin Terrell, Ambrosier, Sprigg and freshman Katelyn Engelbert.

Two Norton boys placed in the pole vault and qualified for the state meet Junior Seth Antrim won the gold medal by vaulting 13'. Freshman Austin Hager finished runner-up with a personal best vault of 12'6".

In addition to Antrim and Hager, sophomore Jacob Brooks also qualified for the state meet with a runner-up finish in the 200 meter dash in 23:27.

In the state meet in Wichita the next weekend, the Norton girls 4x 800 meter relay team placed third with a clocking of 10:14.04 and the Lady Jay 4 x 400 meter relay team set a personal record with a time of 4:09.75 to place fourth.

Moen also earned a fourth place medal in the 3200 meter run with a personal best clocking of 12:11.25.

Teslee Nickell also placed fourth in the shot put with a heave of 36'4".

All three Norton boys competing at the state meet earned Seth Antrim was the runner-up

in the pole vault with a clearance of 13' and Austin Hager placed sixth with a height of 12'.

In the running events, Jacob Brooks placed fourth in the 200 meter dash in 23.07.

Assistant coaches again this season were: Dale Engelbert, Doug Reusink, Todd Fulton and Lucas Melvin.

Plainville was able to score one run to make the final score Norton 9, Plainville 8.


