Final races held Sunday at Norton MX track

dpaxton@nwkansas.com Over 150 riders attended this weekend's final motocross race of the year at the Norton MX track. The Nebraska Cornhusker Motocross Association hosts this NCMA points race. Thirteen races were held throughout the day, some with more than one heat. Male and female riders, young and old, competed with the weather cooperating.

The first race was the Open Outlaw class where 12 riders battled for a first place finish. The only local rider was Jeremy Sproul of Norton who placed sixth to earn himself 15 points.

The second race was the Mini-Open and out of the seven riders, Kelson Kats of Prairie View took third for 20 points. The PIT Bike class was part of the second race and Norton's Nick Mandle took first for 25 points.

The women took center stage in the two heats of the third race. The first heat had three riders, none of which were local riders. In the second heat there were seven riders and Kyleana D. Blau of Oberlin placed seventh, earning 14 points.

The fourth race held was for the Vets and three heats were run. There were no local riders in this division.

The Pee Wee Open was the fifth race held. Nine riders took the course with Ty S. Kats of Prairie

View taking second for 22 points, followed by John Burmaster of Oberlin in fifth for 16 points.

There were 28 riders in the sixth race which was the 250 C Class. Brandon Kats of Prairie View took second, earning himself 22 points followed by Christopher Fisher of Norton in fourth for 18 points and the other local rider was Garret Otter, also of Norton who placed 16th for five points.

The seventh race was the 65 Class for ages six to eight. Trey Kats of Prairie View won this for 25 points, followed by Nicholas Mandle, Jr. placing sixth for 15 points. The second half of this race was the 65 Class for ages nine to eleven. There were no local riders in this event.

The 250 Class was the eighth race held with two heats run. In the 250 A class Jeremy Sproul of Norton placed third for 20 points and there were no local riders in the B Class.

The Pee Wees took the track again for the ninth race. The first group was for the ages of four to six and no local riders competed. In the seven to eight-year-old group Ty S. Kats of Prairie View won the race for 25 points followed by Trey Kats also of Prairie View in second for 22 points. John Burmaster of Oberlin was the only other local rider out of the eleven riders who finished sixth for 15 points.

The tenth race was the Open

Amateur Class where Brandon Morgan of Phillipsburg was the only local rider of the 10 and he finished in eighth place for 13 points. The second part of the tenth race was the Over 40 Class. David Blau of Oberlin competed against eight others and took fifth for 16 points.

Race eleven was for the 85 Class and two heats were run. In the race for ages 12 to 16, Garret Otter of Norton took third for 20 points and in the seven to eleven age group, Kelson Kats took third for 20 points followed by Trenton Chisham of Norton in seventh for 14 points and Tyson Glennemeier also of Norton, in ninth for 12 points.

There were two heats in the 12th race. In the 450 Open A Class Jeremy Sproul won it for 25 points. In the 450 Open B Class there were no local riders competing.

The final race of the day was the 450 Open C Class which was won by Norton's own Christopher Fisher for 25 points followed by Brandon Kats of Prairie View in third for 20 points.

This was the last scheduled race for the Norton track this year. Thank you to all of the volunteers, promoters, riders and spectators who attend the races each time. Look for the 2012 Norton MX Track race schedule and be sure to attend again next year.
