nated by each Pamida store to help underprivileged children purchase needed school supplies.

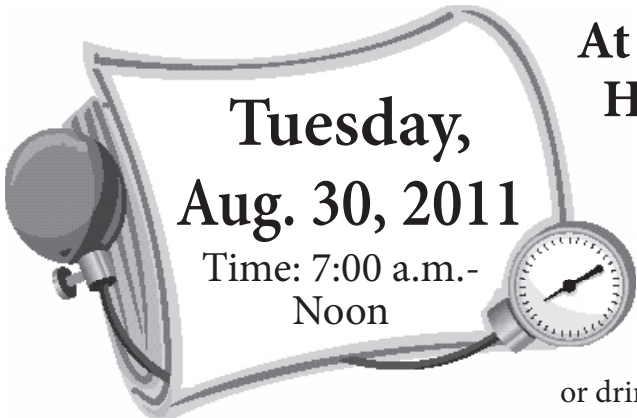
