Colby won the championship with 22 points, followed by Liberal, 14; Norton, 13; Osborne, 13; Scott City, 10.

"There was quite a change in the weather for the Colby Invitational," said coach Green. "After 109 degrees at the Hays Tournament, we get to Colby and the temperature was 60 degrees with a strong north wind and, at times, there was moisture in the air. The girls were getting cold and the north wind affected the flight of the tennis ball, which created some problems for the girls out on the courts."

Norton junior Tawni Griffey continued her unbeaten streak in No.1 singles. She shut out Kathy Nguyen, Liberal, 6-0; shutout Paige Roopchan, Colby, 6-0 and shutout Kathryn Buehler, Scott City, 6-0, to win the championship.

"Tawni continued her winning ways to remain undefeated," said coach Green.

"Her best competition during the day came from Paige Roopchan of Colby. Paige is very athletic and hits a very hard first serve; however, Tawni was up for the challenge and won easily at 6-0."

In No.1 doubles, Norton sophomore Haley Wallingford and junior Katie Koch competed for the Lady Jays. They lost to Krista Kucharik and Ameila Vasko, Scott City, 7-5; lost to Jamie Cockerham and Taylor Noel, Osborne, 6-2 and, in bracket play, defeated Norton juniors Ruth Kendell and Carla Jo Robinson, playing mixed, 6-1 to place fifth.

Kendell and Robinson earlier lost to Megan Schroeder and Keanna Keck, Colby, 6-2 and lost to Lauren Harp and Melissa Alvarado of Liberal, 6-0.

"We entered two teams at No.1 doubles, Haley Wallingford and Katie Koch for our varsity and a second team of Ruth Kendell and Carla Jo Robinson. Haley and Katie played well, including a close match with Scott City in which they came up a little short. Most of their games were very close and, with a few

more points going their way, those close matches could be their victories.
