Norton runners take first at Hays Invite

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Coach George's Rossi's Norton Community High School girls and boys cross country teams won both championships at the Hays Invitational Cross County Meet on Thursday, Sept.15 at Fort Hays State University.

The Norton girls scored 36 points to win the Class 1-4A championship, followed by Thomas More Prep-Marian of Hays, 46; Oakley, 64; Colby,

Norton won the boys championship with 35 points, followed by Colby, 74; Ness City, 80; TMP, 92; Plainville, 98; Stockton, 126.

"Tonight was fantastic!" said coach Rossi. "The weather for most people was yucky with 45 degrees and a bit of rain but for cross country runners it was just about perfect.

"Our girls did a great job of staying together with a one minute, seven second split between our No.1 and 5 runners.

"This was a fast race with many talented girls entered. Eight of the top 10 runners were state medalists last year.

"Our girls team is getting faster in the second mile of the race and that has been an area they have been working on. Our average time was about 45 seconds faster than last year, which is fantastic for this time of the

Norton's five fastest runners on which the team score is based placed in the top 13 individually with four setting personal records.

Placing first for Norton was sophomore Katelyn Engelbert with a personal best time of 16:08 and seventh place finish. Right behind her in eighth place with a personal best clocking of 16:18 was sophomore Darcy Bainter. Third fastest for the Lady Jays with a personal best time of 16:34 was junior Julia Kent in 10th.

Sophomore Marisa Maddy was 11th with a personal best clocking of 16:43 and junior Kamilla Jones was fifth fastest for Norton with a 13th place and time of 17:15.

Also running for the Lady Jays and their place and time were: freshman Sierra Griffith, 14th, personal best time of 17:21 and freshman Jesika Smith, 18th, personal best time of 18:04.

The top 10 individual runners and their times were: Heather Ruder, TMP, 14:55.52, first; Emilea Finley, Colby, 15:05.87; Allison Pfeifer, TMP, 15:26.40, third; Jessie Rubuttom, Ness City, 15:41:44, fourth; Taylor Gabel, Ness City, 15:58.17, fifth; Hayley Ribordy, Oakley, 16:03.14, sixth; Katelyn Engelbert, Norton, 16:08.49, seventh; Darcy Bainter, Norton, 16:18.52, eighth; Cassidy Rathbun, Plainville, 16:31.25, ninth; Julia Kent, Norton, 16:34.82,

"Our boys came out hot on this chilly night and also improved on their times from both this year and last year's meet,"

said coach Rossi.

"Zach Harwell and Bryan Henry did a great job of staying in the first group. Alec Hager and Marc Miller continue to smash their times from last year.

"John Renner is dealing with foot issues but, when we get him feeling better, our boys will be at full strength. This is the best overall race we have run this year. As in the girls race, there were many outstanding runners and our boys represented Norton well."

Norton senior Zach Hartwell led the way for the Blue Jays with a third place finish and a personal record time of 17:04. He was followed by senior Bryan Henry with a time of 17:40 and fifth place finish.

Sophomore Marc Miller was third best for Norton with a sixth place finish in a personal best time of 17:46. He was followed closely by sophomore Alec Hager who placed eighth with a personal best time of 18:00. Rounding out the five team members for Norton was

junior John Renner with a 13th place and time of 18:59.

Also running for the Norton boys and their place and time were: freshman Dalton Vanover, 19th, 19:20 and junior Ryan Bainter, 27th, 20:19.



"There will be 43 girls teams from at least five states represented with more than 200 girls and our boys will see the top five teams from the state meet along with about 35 other teams."

The only Husky touchdown in the first quarter of play was made when Tyson Callaway had a three yard run. Dillon Hogan ran it in for the extra points starting the game off at 8-0. In less then two minutes, Logan scored their first touchdown of the game when Tracy Archer made a 50 yard touchdown run. He then ran it in for the extra points bringing the score to 8-8. Archer finished the quarter with a 37 yard touchdown run but the extra point attempt failed ending the quarter at 14-8 in favor of the Trojans.

Northern Valley was the only team to score in the second quarter. Jordan Baird scored on a 17 yard run. After the run for the extra points failed the first half final score stood at 14-14.

The Huskies dominated the third quarter of play. Baird

scored three touchdowns for the team. The first was on a 17 yard run and a failed extra point attempt bringing the score to 22-14. We made some adjustments at half time and we were able to run the ball much better in the third quarter. The line did another good job of blocking and Jordan Baird was able to go over 200 yards for the second week in a row. Hunter Chandler ran very hard and got his first 100 yards rushing game." ries of the ball for a total of 374 yards versus Logan's 51 carries for 225 yards rushing. Jordan Baird carried the ball 20 times for the Huskies for 237 yards followed by Hunter Chandler with 15 carries and 125 yards, Tyson Callaway with seven carries and 16 yards, and Dillon Hogan with two carries and five yards. Jon Compton had two carries but lost four yards in his attempts followed by Matt Stutsman with one carry that lost the Huskies five yards.

The Huskies passed the ball seven time with two completions and 24 yards. Logan passed it 14 times and completed five for 51 yards. Jordan Baird caught both successful passes for the

The Huskies intercepted three Trojan passes. Callaway got one with no yardage gained followed by Chandler with one for 20 yards and Baird with one for 27 yards.

Callaway punted the ball twice

for 47 yards and Logan punted four times for 115 yards. Northern Valley had three

fumbles for the game and lost all three where Logan fumbled five times losing only one. Calen Back was the leading tackler for Northern Valley. He had eleven tackles and seven

assists followed by Callaway with ten and four assists, and J. Baird with ten and two assists, Ian Vincent had six tackles with four assists followed by Nate Land with six and three assists and Dillon Hogan with six and three.
