Norton tennis takes seventh in tourney

Phillipsburg won the championship with 44 points, followed by Trego Community, 40; Colby, 32; Garden City, 23; Tribune, 17; Scott City, 17; Norton, 12; Liberal, 9.

"Our junior varsity team had some great wins and some disappointing losses on Saturday," said Norton assistant tennis coach Crystal Montgomery.

"We can be playing great in one game and then lose our momentum the very next. It's important to keep your rhythm going throughout a tournament."

Sophomore Jessica White played No.1 singles for the Lady Jays. She lost to Marie Lorent, Colby, 6-0; defeated Trego's Elli Sherwood, 6-5(8-6) and won by a bye. In the finals, she lost to Phillipsburg's Arika Aiken, 6-2 and lost to Garden City's Kylie Owen, 6-5(7-3) to place fourth.

"Jessica had an outstanding comeback in her second match of the day," said coach Montgomery. "Jessica was down 1-4 but was able to come back and win in a tiebreaker. She didn't give up during that match and it showed with her victory.'

Playing No.1 doubles for Norton were junior Carla Jo Robinson and senior Rhees Carlson. They lost to Colby's Kim De-Bie and Samantha Lindberg 6-5(7-3), lost to Trego's Tabitha Wolf and Kimberly Day, 6-1 and lost to Tribune's Marissa Patton and Hannah Whitaker, 6-5(7-1). In the finals, they defeated Liberal's Ana Gonsaley and Kariak Morena, 6-1 and lost to Tribune's Pattan and Whitaker 6-2 to finish sixth.

"Carla Jo and Rhees played each of their opponents tight," said coach Montgomery. "They played in two tiebreakers. Unfortunately, they weren't comfortable enough in the wind and lost both tiebreakers. Both Carla Jo and Rhees had great cross court returns."

Freshman Brooke Sumner played No.2 singles for the Lady Jays. She defeated Colby's Alexa Schindler 6-4, lost to Trego's Bethany Schneider, 6-3 and defeated Tribune's Amanda Berggren 6-3. In the finals, she lost to Phillipsburg's Victoria Main, 6-4; then defeated Garden City's Tania Pastrana, 6-3, to place third.

"Brooke was very consistent at No.2 singles," said coach Montgomery.

"Brooke is one of our most improved players from the beginning of the season. She was able to win some close matches and was able to pull out a third place finish."

At No.2 doubles, playing for Norton were sophomores Jordyn Gosselin and Danielle Wagoner. They lost to Colby's Olivia Wetter and Tresta Urban, 6-3; lost to Trego's Cheyenne Phillips and Shaylee Flax, 6-1 and lost to Tribune's Michaela Blakely and Mariah Brown, 6-0. In the finals, they lost to Scott City's Cheyann Osborn and Anna Miller, 6-1 and lost to Liberal's Jane Pohereckie and Cristina Potina, 6-4, to place eighth.

"Jordyn and Danielle played doubles together in a tournament for the first time but they played well together," said coach Montgomery. "They lost two close matches and, if things had gone the other way, they could have pulled out those matches for wins.

"Jordyn played very well at the baseline, getting many shots back over, and Danielle played very well at the net."
