The Norton junior varsity lost to Ulysses 17-25, 25-17, 14-16 and defeated Goodland 25-18, 25-23.


"In the first game against Ulysses, we started well but fell behind when we had trouble receiving one player's serve," said Norton assistant volleyball coach Traci Uehlin.
