# Blue Jay boys basketball team beat Cambridge

Cambridge led 12-9 after one quarter but the Blue Jays outscored the Trojans 15-12 in the second period to tie the score at 24-all by intermission.

Norton had a good second half. The Blue Jays outscored Cambridge 13-6 in the third quarter and 23-15 in the final stanza.

Leading scorer for Norton was senior power forward Jordan Wahlmeier with 18 points on 6 of 19 from two-point range for 32 percent and 6 of 9 free throws for 67 percent.

Two other Norton players also scored in double figures. Junior guard Jacob Brooks missed all

4 trey tries but swished 6 of 9 two-point shots for 67 percent accuracy and hit 1 of 2 free throws to finish with 13 points. Senior guard Tye Nickell hit 2 of 3 from long range for 67 percent, 3 of 9 from two-point land for 33 percent and 5 of 12 overall for 42 percent and 12 points.

Junior forward Andrew Ellis added 9 points on 1 of 2 trey tries for 50 percent, 2 of 5 two-point attempts for 40 percent and 3 of 7 overall for 43 percent. He also hit a perfect 2 of 2 charity tosses.

As a team, Norton hit 3 of 11 from long range for 27 percent, 21 of 55 two-point tries for 38 percent and 24 of 66 overall for 36 percent.

The Trojans hit 2 of 7 from beyond the arc for 29 percent, 16 of 30 two-point tries for 53 percent and 18 of 37 overall for 49 percent. From the charity stripe, the

Blue Jays swished 9 of 13 for 70

percent and the Trojans hit 7 of 12

for 59 percent.

Norton outrebounded Cambridge 29-24. The Blue Jays pulled down 15 offensive and 14 defensive caroms. Leading rebounder for Norton was Wahlmeier with 14, followed by Tye Nickell, 3; Carson McKenna, 3; Jacob Brooks, 2; Dillon Mc-Conney, 2; Andrew Ellis, 2; Zach Hartwell, 1; Dalton Miller, 1; Alec Gilgenbach, 1.

Norton defenders blocked 6 Trojan shots. Wahlmeier rejected 3, followed by Brooks, 1; Ellis, 1; Gilgenbach, 1. Both teaams had 8 steals. Ja-

cobs and McConney each had 3 thefts, followed by Nickell, McKenna, 1 each. Ellis had Norton's only assist.

The Blue Jays had just 10 turnovers while their aggressive defense caused 27 Trojan turnovers. "I don't think we played very well, especially in the first half,"

said coach Reusink. "We kept

plugging away and finally got the win. "Our bench played a big part in

this game, giving us a spark when we needed it. "We still are making bad deci-

sions on the offensive end and our defensive effort is not consistent but it was great getting a win going into the Christmas break."
