Track teams perform well in early season invite

The Norton Community High School girls and boys track and field teams continued to show improvement in just their third meet of the season with runner-up and third place finishes, respectively, in the annual Plainville Invitational on Tuesday.

Oberlin won the girls championship with 128 points, followed by Norton, 119; Trego Community, 90; Russell, 46; Hill City, 44; La Crosse, 38; Plainville, 34; Ellis, 33; Victoria, 23.

The boys champion was La Crosse with 151 points, followed by Plainville, 97; Norton, 90; Ellis, 65; Hill City, 58; Oberlin, 40; Russell, 21; Victoria, 20; Trego Community, 10.

"In our third varsity meet of the season, we had a great day!" said Norton head track and field coach Jason Jones. "Our girls finished just nine points out of first place and our boys were a solid third!

"We are getting closer to figuring out in which events to enter girls and boys to give us our best team shot down the road in the championship season and we saw some great performances from our people. Austin Hager highlighted the day when he tied the meet record in the pole vault with his winning personal best vault of 13'6".

"Again, we did post new personal records in a number of areas on both sides. That is what we want to see and we are very proud of the effort that our athletes are giving. We continue to be pleased with the results, as well.

"We plant to continue to work to improve and we are excited about this team's future."

The Norton girls scored 24 points in two different events, the pole vault and the 3200 meter run.

Sophomore Baily Ambrosier won the pole vault with a clearance of 8'6", edging sophomore Marisa Maddy who was runner-up with the same height but more misses. Third place went to the Lady Jays' junior Kamilla Jones with a vault of 8'.

Ambrosier also placed third in the 400 meter dash in 1:04.24.

Freshman Sierra Griffith won the 3200 meter run with a personal best time of 13:00.93. Sophomore Darcy Bainter was runner-up in 13:45 and junior Julia Kent placed third with a clocking of 13:50.50.

Sophomore Katelyn Engelbert won the gold medal in the 800 meter run with a time of 2:41.07.

Junior Alec Melvin won another gold medal with a personal best toss of the discus of 117'3". She was also runner-up in the shot put with a heave of 36'.5" and placed third in the javelin with a throw of 109'2", which was only 1 inch out of second.

Junior Teslee Nickell finished fourth in the shot put with a heave of 35'6.

Junior Tawni Griffey placed third in the 1600 meter run with a time of 6:08.50 and fifth in the 800 meter run in a personal best time of 2:47.03.

Bainter placed fifth in the 1600 meter run in 6:25.06 and Kent was right behind her in sixth with a clocking of 6:28.81.

The Lady Jays' 4 x 800 meter relay team of Engelbert, Ambrosier, junior Kamilla Jones and Griffith finished runner-up with a time of 11:00.74.

Senior Erin Terrell combined with Ambrosier, Griffith and Engelbert to place third in the 4 x 400

meter relay in a time of 4:22.5.

Norton's 4 x 100 meter relay team of Terrell, Jones, sophomore Johnnye Ruder and Maddy placed

Jones also finished sixth in the long jump with a leap of 14'3.75".

The Norton boys pole vaulters continued to dominate the field, scoring 22 total points. Sophomore Austin Hager set a personal record by clearing 13'6". In so doing, he tied the meet record set by Brett Ottley of Victoria in 2010.

Senior Seth Antrim cleared 12'6" for runner-up and sophomore Marc Miller cleared 10'6" to place

Miller also earned a gold medal in the 800 meter dash, leading the entire race and finishing in

Norton senior Zach Hartwell also breezed to the win in the 1600 meter run with a time of 4:59.28.

Earning Norton's other gold medal was sophomore Alec Hager with a first place finish in the 3200 meter run in 11:43.62. Junior Jacob Brooks placed runner-up individu-

ally in the high jump with a 6' clearance, third in the 200 meter dash in 23.96 and third in the 100 meter dash in 11.62. Brooks also anchored the 4 x 100 meter relay team

to a runner-up finish in 44.78. Running with him were Hager, senior Bryan Henry and senior Trey Hartwell, Miller, Hager and Henry combined for a third place in the 4 x 800 meter relay with a clocking

of 9:10.37. Junior Carson McKenna, senior Dillon McConney, Hartwell and Henry also ran in the 4 x 400 me-

ter relay where they finished fifth in 3:49.59. Running in the 4 x 100 meter weight relay were junior Lucas Engel, junior Dalton Miller, junior Dylan Sprigg and senior Damien Davis. They finished

fifth in 50.15. Senior Casey Temmel placed sixth in the shotput with a heave of 39'2" and senior Trey Millan finished sixth in the 200 meter dash in a personal record time of 24.33.
