Sign-up for cost share programs ends on May 31

Sign-up for cost sharing of conservation practices will be through May 31.

Practices eligible for cost share in the Water Resources Program will include terraces, waterways, diversions, range seeding, critical area seeding, livestock wells, livestock pipelines, dry pit ponds, solar pumps, field windbreaks and feedlot windbreaks.


The district will also cost share on such items as the plugging of abandoned wells and replacing failing septic systems.

Operations of existing confined feedlots may apply for cost share for practices that control feedlot runoff. Cost share may be used for waste pits, fencing around the pit, diversions and piping. Eligibility also applies where conditions require a facility to be moved.


