On Friday, students at the high school and junior high will be dismissed at 2:15 p.m. to prepare for the parade.

The parade will begin at 2:30 p.m. at the front of the junior high and will end at the Norton County Courthouse. where the Pep Rally will be held at 3 p.m.

Kickoff is 7 p.m. for the football game between Norton and Colby.

The Homecoming Dance will be held at the 4-H Building. It will begin 30 minutes after the game and continue until midnight.

Walk to School Day is this Wednesday in Norton

To promote healthy lifestyle habits for students, Norton Community Schools will participate in International Walk to School Day this Wednesday.

All Eisnehower Elementary studnents and their parents may participate by choosing one of two options.

Parents and students who wish to walk to school in a group can meet at the district's unified office (next to the Norton Public Library) before 7:50 a.m. on Wednesday.

The group will depart from the Unified Office and walk to the elementary school at 7:50 a.m. Bus students who normally ride the bus from the unified office to Eisenhower can either walk or ride the bus as usual. The walking group will have additional adult supervision including Mr. Roy, Mrs. Bolt and Nurse Joan.

Parents and students may also choose to walk to school in groups from their homes to the school.

The Walk to School Day will occur as weather permits. The group will not walk from the unified office in the event of rain, sleet, snow or if the temperature is below 32 degrees. Parents should make sure their children are dressed appropriately and wearing walking shoes to walk to school.

Students who plan to eat breakfast at the school will still have time to do so after they arrive at the school.

Before walking to school, parents are encouraged to review and discuss the following safety rules with their children:

-Anyone under 10 years of age should not cross the street alone

-Stop at the curb before crossing the street

-Walk, don't run, across the street

-Cross at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks

-Walk facing traffic

-Make sure drivers see you before crossing in front of them

-Do not play in driveways, streets, parking lots or unfenced yards by the street

-Wear white clothing or reflectors when walking at night

-Cross at least 10 feet in front of a school bus.
