Logan grad was Fort Hays track star

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Tim McElroy, a very strong young man from Logan, has completed an outstanding career as a weight man for the Fort Hays State University men's track and field team.

A valuable member of the Tigers' squad, Tim redshirted one year and was a points producer in 2011-12 as a fifth year senior in the discus, hammer throw and shot put.

One of the highlights of his senior season this spring was a runner-up finish in the hammer throw in the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association Outdoor Track & Field Championships with a throw of 191'2", which was barely behind the winner. His performance earned him All-MIAA honors.

Tim also heaved the shot a personal record distance of 49'7" in the MIAA Championships to place sixth.

He threw the hammer so well this season that he qualified along with three other Tigers for the NCAA Division II Outdoor Track & Field Championships which were held May 24-26 in Pueblo, Colo. He advanced with a gold medal performance in the hammer throw with a seasonbest and personal record distance of 197'10" which he recorded at the Alex Francis Classic on March 23. Tim ranked No.14 in the nation in the hammer throw at that time.

He hit a provisional mark six times during the season in the hammer throw for the Tigers.

Tim also threw the discus a personal best distance of 159'1" in the Alex Francis Classic to place runner-up.

After qualifying for nationals, Tim was chosen to the All-Regional team by the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association. The top five in each region in individual events were honored.

In the national championships, Tim placed 14th in the hammer throw with a distance of 192'7".

Tim redshirted in 2010-11 and competed unattached in some meets to maintain his strength and skill.

His sophomore and junior years at Fort Hays, Tim qualified for and competed in the hammer throw in the national championship track meet, finishing as high as 12th in the nation.

As a junior, Tim set his personal record at the time in the hammer throw with a distance of 193'2" and set his personal best at the time in the discus with a throw of 157'1".

Tim was a two-time state gold medal winner in the discus and one time state champion in the shot put in high school.

Tim graduated in May, 2012 from Fort Hays State University with a degree in Health Promotion and Wellness.

He is the son of Glenda and Mickie McElroy of Logan. His grandparents are Bonnie and Bethel McElroy, Gerry Pearson and Robert Wood.
