Lady Jays take third in the Topside Tip-Off

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Coach George Rossi's Norton Community High School girls basketball team won third place in the annual Topside Tip-Off Tournament held in Goodland.

After defeating Wray, Colo. 42-32 on Thursday, they lost 72-28 to Ottawa on Friday, then outscored Sharon Springs 35-24 on Saturday.

McCook defeated Ottawa 59-52 for the championship on Saturday. Oakley outscored Burlington, Colo. 41-32 to win the consolation championship and Wray, Colo. defeated Goodland 47-36 for seventh.

Wray, Colo.

With senior point guard Tawni Griffey leading the way, the Norton Lady Jays won their opening game in the tournament by a 42-32 score over Wray,

Griffey, who was absent in the season opening loss to Goodland, scored 16 points on 2 of 5 three point tries for 40 percent, 3 of 9 two-point attempts for 33 percent and 5 of 14 overall for 36 percent from the field. She was perfect from the free throw line, where she hit 4 of 4.

Norton led from start to finish. The Lady Jays were on top 13-4 after one quarter, 21-12 at intermission and 30-24 at the third quarter mark.

"This was a big win for a number of reasons," said first year head coach George Rossi. "First, just to show our girls that they can win and we needed a win for down the road and the league tournament.

"Our girls were much more aggressive tonight than in the first game. While we still made way too many turnovers, I felt that we did a better job with the ball in our hands. Our free throws were also improved.

"We need to put in a lot of work on our press and zone defense. We let too many girls get open on the backside and, fortunately for us, Wray missed quite a few easy shots.

"This win over Wray was absolutely a step in the right direc-

Norton hit more shots from beyond the arc than from closer in to get the offense going in the first quarter. Johnnye Ruder, who is a junior, swished two

three-point baskets and Griffey hit one from long range in addition to a two-point basket. Junior Katelyn Engelbert added a two-point basket.

Griffey hit another shot from beyond the arc in the second period along with a two-point basket. Senior Kamilla Jones added a two-point basket and junior Bailey Ambrosier hit a free throw.

Ruder hit another three-point basket and one from two-point range in the third quarter and Jones became the third Lady Jay to hit from long range when she buried a shot from beyond the arc. Ambrosier added another free throw.

Wray tried fouling in the fourth quarter to get the ball but the strategy didn't work. Norton hit just three baskets in the quarter but also swished 6 of 10 free throws. Griffey hit four charities and a basket, Ambrosier swished two free throws and a basket and Jones hit her third basket of the night.

Ruder also scored in double figures for the Lady Jays. She hit a perfect 3 of 3 three-point attempts for 100 percent, 1 of 8 two-point tries for 13 percent and 4 of 11 overall for 36 percent and 11 points.

As a team, Norton hit 6 of 13 three-point tries for 46 percent, 8 of 38 two-point attempts for 21 percent and 14 of 51 overall for 27 percent.

From the free throw line, Norton hit 8 of 14 for 57 percent compared to 3 of 14 for 21 percent by Wray.

The Lady Jays pulled down 10 offensive and 22 defensive rebounds for 32 total. Wray grabbed 9 offensive and 25 defensive caroms for 34 total.

Leading rebounder for Norton was Engelbert with 8, followed by Ambrosier, 6; Katie Bohl, 4; Jones, 4; Griffey, 3; Darcy Bainter, 3; Alec Melvin, 3; Ruder, 1.

The Lady Jays' aggressive defense blocked 6 Wray shots. Bohl led the way with 2 blocks followed by Griffey, Engelbert, Ambrosier and Ruder, 1 each.

Norton had 10 steals and Wray stole the ball 9 times.

The Lady Jays had 6 offensive assists. Griffey, Bainter, Bohl, Ambrosier, Ruder and Jones each had 1.

Both teams had a lot of turnovers; Wray lost the ball 29 times and Norton 24.

Norton met an excellent Ottawa team in the championship semi-finals on Saturday and the Lady Jays were overwhelmed

Ottawa held quarter leads of 24-9, 45-15 and 60-19.

Tawni Griffey hit a basket and free throw, Bailey Ambrosier scored on four free throws and Alec Melvin hit a basket for Norton in the first quarter.

Griffey's two baskets from beyond the arc accounted for the Lady Jays' points in the second period.

Katelyn Engelbert swished a three-point basket and Ambrosier hit a charity toss for Norton's third quarter points.

Griffey finished the game in the fourth period with a three and a two-point basket while Ambrosier and Kamilla Jones each hit a two-point basket.

"We knew Ottawa would be very tough but it was a buzz saw," said coach Rossi. "Fortunately, we still have all

Being more aggressive and stronger is something we will be spending a great deal of time on in practice, along with everything else we need to improve

Griffey was leading scorer for Norton with 14 points on 3 of 9 shots from beyond the arc for 33 percent, 2 of 7 two-point tries for 29 percent and 5 of 16 overall for 31 percent along with 1 of 2 free throws.

As a team, the Lady Jays hit 4 of 13 three-point shots for 31 percent, 5 of 21 two-point tries for 24 percent and 9 of 34

overall for 26 percent. Ottawa made 4 of 5 from long range for 80 percent, 25 of 51 two-point shots for 49 percent.

From the free throw line, Norton hit 6 of 17 for 35 percent compared to 10 of 17 for 59 percent by Ottawa.

The Lady Jays had 5 offensive and 10 defensive rebounds for 15 total. Ottawa pulled down 15 offensive and 21 defensive caroms for 36 total.

Leading rebounder for Norton was Ambrosier with 4, followed by Jones, 3; Griffey, Bainter, Melvin, 2 each; Engelbert, Peyton Renner, 1 each.
