### Past medalist honored

The honorees were escorted onto the gym floor by the NCHS cheerleaders. Each honored wrestler received a "Certificate of Wrestling Excellence" and congratulatory handshake from Norton Community High School Activities Director Dustin McE-

Current Norton head wrestling coach Bill Johnson began to recognize the "Norton Wrestling Tradition" during his first year in Norton in 1992.

Norton has won 11 state wrestling team championships and has had 290 individual state medal winners and 92 individual state champions.

The 1943 team placed second in the state and had seven placers. They were Ralph Mason, Vic Peterson, Keith Sanderson, Russell Awalt, Lewis Howell, Eldon Archer and Gerald Horning. None of them were able to be present.

Raymond Hewett was a state placer from 1953 but was also unable to be present.

by Jake Durham and had two state placers: Rod Fisher, Collinsville, Okla., who placed third and Richard Miller, Norton, who placed fourth at 112 pounds. Fisher was unable to be present but Miller was present and received his certificate.

The 1973 Norton team was also coached by Jake Durham and they were winners of the Class 3A state championship. Honored were Bill Klein, Norton, first at 98 pounds; Evan Whitney, Norton, first at 138 pounds; Dave Ward, Hays, second at 105 pounds; Roland Washburn, Norton, third at 132 pounds; Bruce Koel, Princeton University, N.J., third at 145 pounds and Keith Sides, Redmond, Ore., first at 126 pounds. Sides was the only one unable to be present.

The 1983 Norton team placed third in the Class 4A state tournament and they were also coached by Jake Durham. Honored were Kent Hahn, Stockton, first at 132 pounds; Shane Wyatt, Norton, first at 185 pounds; Chuck Dalton, deceased, fourth at 138 pounds and Stan Wahlmeier, Burlington, fourth at 167 pounds. Wahlmeier was the only wrestler from the team who was present. Dalton's certificate was accepted by his uncle Jake Dur-

Norton's 1993 team was coached by Bill Johnson. Billy The 1963 team was coached Smith, Norton, was the only

medal winner. He placed sixth at 112 pounds but was unable to be present.

The Blue Jay 2003 team compiled a 12-0 dual meet record en route to a second place finish in the Class 3-2-1A state tournament. They were also coached by Bill Johnson. Medalists were: Clay Madden, first, 103, freshman year; Luke Pfannenstiel, fifth, 112, freshman year; Lance Roe, fifth, 119, freshman year; James Annon, first, 125, junior year; Eric Johnson, second, 145, senior year; Tim Sprigg, sixth, 160, senior year; Bo Pfannenstiel, fifth, 171, junior year; Michael Sprigg, second, 275, sophomore year.

All were present except for James Annon and Michael Sprigg. Annon's award was accepted by his father Bobby Annon and Sprigg's award was accepted by his brother, Tim Sprigg.

This was the 48th annual wrestling tournament held in Norton and the 16th annual Durham tournament. It was renamed for longtime Norton wrestlng coach J.R. "Jake" Durham.

# Norton edged out by the Plainville Cardinals

The tight first quarter ended
