They made their home in California until Delbert was honorably discharged from the Navy in 1955, then returned to Kansas where they lived on Bow Creek in Graham County before moving to Lenora where Delbert farmed with his father.

tron of the Order of the Eastern Star, and served for many years as treasurer of the Prairie Dog Shrine Club. Drill Team from the Logan area is offering horse rides beginning at 3 p.m. and at 4:30 p.m. they will demonstrate their precision drill routines. This is a popular group and will thrill the crowds with their costumes, horses and flag ceremonies.

Appearing on stage at 5:30 p.m. will be the “Dueling Pianos.” This group of musicians from Denver, Colo., are more than just music; it’s crowd interaction, comedy, and fun all in one. Request your favorite song. The crowd determines what is played. No two shows are ever the same. Caz Bzdek and Paul Seiz will perform the entire show on portable baby grand piano replicas.

Starting a 6:30 p.m. there will be free tethered hot air balloon rides for family enjoyment. View the country side around the Logan area from this great
