City requests additional funding

City Clerk Darla Ellis told the City Council at its Wednesday meeting that the City had been approved for a 2014 Downtown Commercial Rehabilitation grant it had applied for to rehabilitate the building located at 109 E. Main Street. The problem, however, is the amount approved is \$75,000 less than what was requested on the application. Ellis said a request for additional funding has been made to the Kansas Department of Commerce, and a decision on the matter should come soon.

Norton Area Chamber of Commerce Director Tara Vance notified the council that the Norton County Community Foundation received \$69,000 in donations, which will be given to the City to purchase a pool heater. When the City receives the money, the council will

approve an alternate bid for the pool heater at a cost of \$69,000.

Brian Thompson of Mapes and Miller, C.P.A's, presented to the council the city's 2012 audit report. He said the City complied with all state statutes and no violations or areas of noncompliance were found. However, due to the amount of federal funds the City received an additional audit, an A-133 single fund audit, was also required. Thompson said there were no findings or violations with this audit as well. The council accepted the 2012 audit report and it will be filed with the State of Kansas.

McCook Walmart evacuated Sunday

The Walmart Super Center in Mc-Cook had to be evacuated Sunday after a man created a chorine gas from pouring bleach and ammonia on the

Isaac Brown, police chief in Mc-Cook, said an adult male was taken into custody and later transferred to a mental health facility after pouring bleach and ammonia on the floor near the service department while shouting irrational phrases.

"That can be very dangerous to a person's respiratory system," he said. Luckily no one suffered substantial injuries.

Mr. Brown said the McCook Fire Department and ambulance were called to the scene and had to treat twelve people for respiratory problems, which included a McCook police officer. Three of the 12 people were taken to the McCook Community Hospital to be treated, he said, but were later released.

No criminal charges have been brought to the male, he said, because police are still determining the charges. The man was placed in emergency protective custody, he said, and no further information can be released about him.
