Norton football season ends with close loss

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com The Norton-Phillipsburg rivalry was as heated as ever on Thursday night at Travis Field in Norton when the two football teams met to determine which would advance into the playoffs.

It was a very, very close game with Norton leading in total offense, yards per play and first downs and fewer punts but the Panthers ending with a few more points in a 20-16 victory.

The District win for Phillipsburg put them in a Sub-District game at Salina Sacred Heart this Tuesday and put a sudden halt to the Blue Jay season with a 5-4 record. Norton's only losses were to teams which made the playoffs.

The Blue Jays were the dominant team in the first quarter, scoring two touchdowns on runs by senior tailback Tanner Furbush before allowing the visiting Panthers a first down!

With 1:49 left in the first quarter, Phillipsburg completed their first pass but it was a big one. Senior quarterback Riley Juenemann hit senior wingback Grant Wickham on a 48 yard strike.

Early in the second period, Phillipsburg slowed the Norton offense enough that the Blue Jays tried a fourth down field goal. Senior kicker Austin Hager was accurate from 30 yards and Norton had extended their lead to 16-7. The Panthers responded with a scoring drive to cut the Blue Jay advantage to 16-14.

A longer field goal try by Hager from 45 yards out was just short and Norton led 16-14 at halftime.

Phillipsburg scored with 3:10 left in the third quarter to take a 20-16 lead and it held through the final quarter. Two pass interceptions and a fumble hurt the Norton offense the rest of the way and they were just not able to make the plays they needed to retake the lead.

"I was proud of the way we played," said Norton head football coach Lucas Melvin. "We just didn't get any breaks and had too many turnovers." The Blue Jays had just three turnovers but Phillipsburg had none.

"In a close game, you can't have three turnovers," he said.

"We played well enough to win but just couldn't get any breaks. Our players were motivated and wanted to keep playing.

"I'm really proud of our players. We had a great season. We played hard and overcame a lot of adversity. We got a lot better as the season progressed. The only teams we lost to are in the playoffs."

Austin Hager kicked off for Norton to start the game. The Panther receiver was stopped on their 20-yard line. The Blue Jay defense held the visitors to three-and-out and they punted to the Norton 28 where Furbush caught the ball.

Furbush picked up a first down on the first play, then senior fullback Toby Nickell ran for 4 yards and a face mask penalty against the Panthers moved the ball to the Panther 42. Furbush and sophomore quarterback Jordan Dole each gained yards before Dole passed to Nickell for a first down on the Panther 23. Furbush got the call again and ran through two potential tacklers into the end zone standing up! Hager's extra point kick was blocked but Norton led 6-0 with 8:24 left.

Dole handed to Furbush and he bulled four yards running out. W

into the end zone as the Norton fans roared! This time, Hager's extra point kick was good, making it 13-0 with 4:52 remaining.

After Hager's kickoff, Phillipsburg picked up their initial first down of the game on their first pass reception, the 48-yard pass from Juenemann to Wickham. Jaron Kellerman kicked the extra point, cutting the Norton lead to 13-7 with 1:49 left.

Sophomore running back Gavin Lively returned the Panther kickoff to the 15. Furbush made another great run to the Norton 43. Nickell picked up 7 yards on 2 plays and Phillipsburg was whistled for offsides, giving Norton the ball on the Panther 45 to end the first quarter.

A Dole pass to junior tight end Mickey Hahn earned Norton a first down on the Phillipsburg 28. With Furbush getting most of the carries, the Blue Jays advanced far enough for Hager to split the uprights with a 30-yard field goal for a 16-7 Norton lead with 8:27 left.

Phillipsburg took Hager's kickoff and put together their best drive of the game to score their second touchdown on a 3 yard run by Juenemann. Kellerman's extra point kick cut Norton's lead to 16-14 with 5:41 left.

running out. What would have been a 45-yard field goal by Hager fell just short and the first half ended with the Blue Jays clinging to a 16-14 lead.

Furbush returned the kickoff to open the second half and the Blue Jays moved the ball to the Panther 37 where they took over after a fourth down punt fake by Norton fell short. Phillipsburg put together a touchdown drive that was climaxed by a 2 yard run by senior fullback Michael Dusin. A pass for two extra points was dropped but Phillipsburg had taken a 20-16 lead with 3:10 left in the third quarter.

Norton sophomore Cameron Heikes recovered Phillipsburg's short kickoff on the 50. On third down, a Dole pass was intercepted on the Panther 14. A third down pass play for Phillipsburg was good to the Panther 35 for a first down as the third period came to a close.

The aggressive Norton defense held the Panthers and forced them to punt to the Norton 30. A Dole pass was intercepted and the Panther catching the ball was tackled on the Norton 7-yard line! Norton's goalline stand was a good one and included Hager knocking down a fourth down pass with 7:16 left in the game. With Furbush, Nickell and Dole picking up yards, Norton moved downfield for a possible go-ahead touchdown. After Furbush broke two tackles on a run to the Panther 34, the Blue Jays' scoring chances ended when Dole was hit hard, fumbled and was injured. The Panthers recovered the pigskin on their 40.

Individual statistics

In his final game as a Blue Jay, Tanner Furbush had another outstanding rushing game. He carried the ball 22 times for 127 yards and a 5.8 yard average. Jordan Dole had 10 carries for 49 yards and a 4.9 yard average. Toby Nickell gained 21 yards on 7 carries, followed by Kendall Miller, 3 for 10 and Christian Boser, 1 for 2.

Dole completed 8 of 11 passes for 91 yards. Miller completed 1 for 7 yards. Receivers were Furbush, 4 for 43 yards; Mickey Hahn, 2 for 33; Nickell, 2 for 15; Drew Schrum, 1 for 7.

Austin Hager kicked off 4 times for a 49 yard average and Nickell punted once for 33 yards.

Furbush had 2 kickoff returns for 25 yards and Gavin Lively had 1 for 7 yards. Lively had 1 punt return for 8 yards and Furbush had 1 for 3.
