Blue Jays lose sight of victory in first game

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Coach Doug Reusink's Norton Community High School boys basketball team had a season-opening victory in their sights for three quarters Friday night in Goodland before falling 54-49 to the home standing Cowboys.

Norton led 16-12 after one quarter, 30-25 at halftime and 38-33 after three quarters. Both teams had four field goals in the fourth period but Goodland hit 11 free throws compared to 3 for Norton.

After sophomore Quinton Porter swished a long threepoint shot, senior Trever Lewis stole the ball and drove for two points and junior Conor Cox blocked a Goodland shot, Norton led 45-38 with just five minutes remaining in the game. Goodland hit the next seven points to tie the score at 45-all. Then, a Norton turnover against the full court press and a threepoint basket by the Cowboys gave them just their second lead of the game at 48-45. Porter stepped to the line and hit two free throws to make it 48-47 with 2:02 left.

Two Goodland free throws made it 50-47 with time running out. Senior Drew Schrum gave Norton a slight chance of winning when he hit a basket from the baseline with 26.8 seconds left to cut the Cowboy lead to 50-49. Norton had to foul in an effort to get the ball back but Goodland hit four more free throws in the finals seconds of play to stretch their margin of victory to five points.

"I was very pleased with how we played," said coach Reusink. "We had trouble defending Gage Ihrig but the rest of our defensive effort was very good.

"Offensively, we had some boys step up which was a ques- 23 two point attempts for 43

tion mark coming in. We did struggle against their press at times and we need to get better with our late game execution but those things are correctable."

Drew Schrum finished with 20 points on 58 percent field goal shooting. He hit 3 of 7 from long range for 43 percent and 4 of 5 from two-point range for 80 percent. Schrum also hit 3 of 5 free throws for 60 percent. Conor Cox added 9 points on 4 of 10 from the field for 40 percent and was 1 of 2 on free throws

Gage lhrig led Goodland with 24 points while Gannon Ihrig added 11.

As a team, Norton hit 5 of 16 from three-point range for 31 percent, 12 of 34 two-point tries for 35 percent and 17 of 50 overall for 34 percent.

Goodland scored on 7 of 20 triple tries for 35 percent, 10 of percent and 17 of 43 overall for 40 percent.

From the free throw line, the Blue Jays swished 10 of 15 for 67 percent compared to 13 of 19 for 68 percent by the Cowboys.

Norton grabbed 8 offensive and 18 defensive rebounds for 26 total while Goodland pulled down 9 offensive and 18 defensive caroms for 27 total.

Leading rebounder for Norton was senior Tanner Furbush, who grabbed 6 offensive and 6 defensive rebounds for 12 total.

Norton had 6 offensive assists. Furbush and Schrum each had 2 assists. Cox blocked 5 shots.

The Blue Jays had 12 steals while the Cowboys had just 1.

Coach David Stover's Norton junior varsity boys team also had a close contest but came out a 44-42 winner.

Norton led 13-11 after one quarter, trailed 22-21 at halftime and was behind 35-29 after three quarters but outscored the Cowboys 15-7 in the fourth period to win the game.

Freshman Tyus Henson led the young Blue Jays in scoring with 14 points, followed by junior Breven Sondergaard with 10 points. Other scorers were: Quinton Porter, 8; junior Derick Campbell, 5; junior Jordan Karnoppp, 4; junior Connor Griffey, 3.

Teeter was high scorer for Goodland with 14 points.

The Lady Jays stayed with the Lady Cowboys in a low scoring first half but did not keep up after intermission.

Norton trailed 10-7 after one quarter and by just 18-17 at halftime. The Lady Jays hit just 6 points in the third quarter, however, to trail 29-23 and hit only one basket in the final period.

"This was not what we wanted tonight," said Norton head coach George Rossi.

"Our execution was completely lacking in all areas of the game. Coming in, I was concerned with the possibility of turnovers. Unfortunately, our fears came true. We need to take better care of the ball and be more patient.

"On defense, we need to do a

better job of communicating.

"We will get better. Our girls know how to work hard and we all learned a lot about ourselves tonight. Communication and becoming both mentally and physically tougher will be our focus."

Eight different players scored for Norton but the high scorer was freshman Caitlyn Cox with just 6 points on three two-point baskets. Seniors Darcy Bainter and Bailey Ambrosier each added 4 points.

Leading scorer for Goodland was Faith Biermann with 10 points. Brianna White added 8.

As a team, Norton hit 2 of 15 three-point shots for 13 percent, 8 of 19 two-point tries for 42 percent and 10 of 34 overall for 29 percent.

Goodland hit 2 of 12 from long range for 17 percent, 16 of 38 two-point attempts for 42 percent and 18 of 50 overall for 36 percent.

From the free throw line, Norton was 3 of 12 for 25 per-

cent and Goodland swished 4 of 11 for 36 percent.

The Lady Jays pulled down 7 offensive and 19 defensive rebounds for 26 total compared to 27 for Goodland. Cox led Norton with 9 rebounds, followed by senior Katelyn Engelbert, 8; Bailey Ambrosier, 3; sophomore Casey Ambrosier, 3; Bainter, 2; senior Johnnye Ruder, 1.

Norton had just 4 steals in the game, 1 each from Engelbert, Bailey Ambrosier, Ruder and Casey Ambrosier. Goodland stole the ball 14 times.

The Lady Jays had 27 turnovers compared to 16 by the Lady Cowboys.

Norton had 8 offensive assists. Engelbert led with 4, followed by Ruder, 3; freshman Miah Melvin, 1.

Junior varsity

The Norton girls junior varsity lost to Goodland by a score of 45-25.

Norton trailed by quarters 11-2, 17-15 and 25-23 but was outscored 20-2 in the fourth quarter.

Leading scorer for Norton was Caitlyn Cox with 9, followed by sophomore Peyton Renner, 4; sophomore Casey Ambrosier, 4; Miah Melvin, 2; sophomore Lexi Voss, 2; freshman Kristen Dole, 2; junior Erin Archer, 1; freshman Baylee Miller, 1.

"We started out okay and were behind by only two points to start the fourth quarter but then our girls off the bench struggled with getting any momentum and we were nearly shut out in the fourth quarter," said Norton assistant coach Joan Bolt.

"We did learn a list of things we need to work on: communication and footwork on defense and stronger passing and running on offense with the mindset to score."

Thompson led Goodland in scoring with 15 points.

"We saw some glimpse of potential but we need to work on our consistency," said Norton assistant coach Cherie Brooks.

"Our girls worked hard the whole game and did not give up. We just had too many turnovers.

"Our post players performed well offensively. We will continue to work on blocking out better and taking care of the basketball as a team."


