## Norton Blue Jays lose to Stockton Tigers

The Norton Community High School boys basketball team played hard in their Mid-Continent League game with state-ranked and undefeated Stockton in the Stull Gym on Tuesday evening and all statistics for both teams were about the same except for one very important one.

Free throw shooting percentage was the same, rebounds were nearly the same and turnovers were as well but one very important statistic was not close. Norton hit just 20 percent from the field while Stockton swished 38 percent of their shots. The result was a 41-26 loss for the Blue Jays.

Neither team actually scored many points until the final quarter. The score was tied 8-all after one quarter where sophomore Quinton Porter scored all of Norton's points on a two-point basket, a three-point basket and free throw. Senior Drew Schrum scored Norton's only two points in the second period. Stockton tallied 11 points to lead 19-10 at intermission.

The lid remained on the basket for Norton in the third quarter when the Blue Jays scored just two points again, this time on two free throws by junior Conor Cox. The Tigers hit just two baskets and one free throw in the period but still led 24-12 with one quarter remaining.

Both teams had their best scoring in the final period when the Blue Jays tallied 14 points and Stockton scored 17 more. Norton senior Tanner Furbush, who has been the leading scorer for the Blue Jays but saw limited action due to foul trouble, hit two baskets in the final stanza. Porter hit his third basket of the night along with a free throw, Schrum swished his second basket of the game and senior Marc Miller hit a three-pointer for his only points in the contest.

Porter was high scorer for Norton with 9 points on 1 three-point, 2 two-point baskets and 2 free throws. Jaden Williams was leading scorer for Stockton with 15 points.

As a team, Norton hit 2 of 15 three-point attempts for 13 percent, 7 of 31 two-point tries for 23 percent and 9 of 46 overall for 20 percent. Stockton found the range on 3 of 12 trey tries for 25 percent, 11 of 25 two-point attempts for 44 percent and 14 of 37 overall for 38 percent.

From the free throw stripe, the Blue Jays hit 6 of 12 for 50 percent and the Tigers swished 10 of 20 for 50 percent.

Rebounding was also fairly even. Norton grabbed 11 offensive and 18 defensive rebounds for 29 total. Stockton pulled down 8 offensive and 25 defensive caroms for 33 total.

Eight different Norton players shared in the

rebounding. Conor Cox led with 9, followed by Quinton Porter, 7; Trever Lewis, 4; Tanner Furbush, 3; Marc Miller, 2; Drew Schrum, 2; Tyus Henson, 1; Kobie Unterseher, 1.

Norton had 5 steals and Stockton recorded 8

thefts. Furbush had 2 steals, followed by Quinton Porter, Marc Miller, Conor Cox, 1 each.

Cox blocked 3 shots and Schrum rejected 1. The Blue Jays had 4 assists. Henson had 2 while

Porter and Lewis each had 1.

Norton had 12 turnovers and Stockton had 10. "I was very happy with how we played defensively,"said Norton head boys basketball coach Doug Reusink. "We executed well offensively in the first half but couldn't get shots to

"This tournament continues to be a quality tournament," said Norton assistant coach Shane Miller. "It is run with pools which allow most wrestlers to receive five matches. At the end of a long day, one in each weight class is crowned champion, three receive runner-up and eight other wrestlers place in the top five for a third place team finish.

"Leading the way for Norton was Skylar Johnson at 106. He was in a three-man round robin and pinned both of his opponents in the first period.

"Ethan Ross is a varsity wrestler at 120 pounds who was scheduled to take his ACT on Saturday so entered this tournament. Ethan went 4-1. Ethan had some good matches and was definitely challenged in his finals match where he lost to place second. Other finalists were Kade Unterseher, 113 and Mike Kasson, 145. Both are wrestling well for this early in the season. Kade was 3-1 while Mike was 4-1.

"Dalton Vanover put in a quality performance at 138 pounds in his first competition of the year. He went 4-1 for the day. The way the criteria for the bracket worked out, after losing in the second round, Dalton had to battle in his next three matches for a fifth place finish. Dalton ended the day with a major decision win, technical fall win and one pin for a win. For his performance, Dalton was voted Norton's "Junior Varsity Wrestler of the Week".

"The competition for the past few years at Southern Valley has been good and we always have to adjust to the number cine Valley, 9-4 to place third. of matches for each wrestler. This tournament was what we needed and a challenge for our young wrestlers early in the sea-
