Norton wrestlers fight to win TOC title

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Coach Bill Johnson's Norton Community High School varsity wrestling team held off a late challenge by Phillipsburg to successfully defend their 2013 championship in the third annual Western Kansas Tournament of Champions held Saturday in

Sixteen teams competed in the tournament which started two years ago as a competition between the Northwest Kansas and Mid-Continent League. Different teams have been added since the inception of the tournament.

The Blue Jays had been passed for the team lead by the Panthers but Norton regained the lead in the consolation rounds to lead by five and one-half points when the finals began. When the championship matches were finished, Norton had extended their lead to win over Phillipsburg by 33.5 points.

Wrestling in the finals was on three mats for fifth, third and first places. Norton had five wrestlers going for first and all five were champions!

Norton finished with 194.5 points, followed by Phillipsburg, 161; Smith Center, 128.5; Oberlin, 115; Oakley, 110; Plainville, 100.5; Ellis, 92; Atwood, 87; St. Francis, 79.5; Leoti, 59; Hill City, 51; Hoxie 41; Trego, 35; 28; Thomas More Prep-Hays,

Winning gold medals for Norton were Skylar Johnson, 106; Alec Hager, 138; Kendall Miller, 160; Kolton Harting, 195 and Jacob Green, 220.

Finishing in third place were Branson Addington, 113; Jared Tallent, 145 and Cole Renner, 170. Mike Kasson, 152, placed fourth and Trenton Wright, 126, sixth. Michael Johnson, 285, also wrestled for the Blue Jays.

Norton wrestling coach receives national award

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Bill Johnson, head wrestling coach at Norton Community High School, is one of two Kansas coaches and 21 high school coaches from across the country selected as 2013 National Coaches of the Year by the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) Coaches Association.

The NFHS, which has been recognizing coaches through an awards program since 1982, honors coaches in the top 10 girls sports and top 10 boys sports (by participation numbers) and in one other sport that is not included in the top 10 listings. Winners of NFHS awards must be active coaches during the year for which they receive their award. This year's awards recognize coaches for the 2012-13 school year.

Coach Johnson has coached wrestling for 26 years and has compiled a 222-78 record, which is winning 74 percent of all matches. In that time, he has guided his teams to six state championships, most recently in 2013, to go along with 14 league championships and 11 regional championships.

In addition to being the Class 3-2-1A defending state wrestling champions, the current Norton wrestling team is ranked No.1 in the state and seven Blue Jays wrestlers are ranked in the top ten in their weight class.

Coach Johnson currently holds a seat on the Kansas Wrestling Coaches Association executive board, which he has held since 1989. Most recently, coach Johnson

received the Kansas Wrestling Coaches Association Class 3-2-1A Coach of the Year award in 2013, an award he has won three previous times in 1997, 2001 and 2010.
