Norton Blue Jays suffer loss to Hill City

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com The Norton Community High School varsity boys basketball team ran into a hot shooting Hill City quintet on their floor Friday night and suffered a 61-33 loss in Mid-Continent League play.

Neither team hit well from three-point range, but Hill City swished 26 of 45 two-point tries for a net smoking 58 percent. Norton shot just 27 two-point shots and hit only 11 for 41 percent.

Hill City held quarter leads of 13-7, 33-18 and 40-28.

"We were outplayed from the start," said Norton head coach Doug Reusink.

"Our defense let us down tonight. Hill City executed their offense well and we did nothing defensively to take them out of what they wanted to do.

"We struggled against their 2-2-1 press and just could not get anything going offensively. "We just have to keep our

heads up and bounce back." Leading scorer for Nor-

ton was Drew Schrum with 10 points. He was 2 of 5 from three-point range for 40 percent, 1 of 4 on two-point tries for 25 percent and 3 of 9 overall for 33 percent. He hit both free throws. Breven Sondergaard added 6 points on 3 of 4 from the field for 75 percent accuracy.

Deric McKeever led Hill City with 18 points. He was followed closely by Shane Jones with 16.

Hill City also outshot Norton from the free throw line. The Ringnecks hit 9 of 13 charities for 69 percent and the Blue Jays swished 5 of 9 for 56 percent.

Norton outrebounded Hill City 30-20 with the difference on the offensive boards where the Ringnecks were hitting very well. The Blue Jays pulled down 11 offensive and 19 defensive boards while the Ringnecks grabbed just 4 offensive and 16 defensive caroms.

Leading rebounder for Norton was Tanner Furbush who pulled down 14 boards, followed by Quinton Porter, 4; Drew Schrum, 4; Breven Sondergaard, 3; Conor Cox, 2; Tyus Henson, 1; Marc Miller, 1; Kobie Unterseher, 1.

Henson had 3 of Norton's 8 offensive assists, followed by Quinton Porter, 2; Schrum, 2; Cox, 1.

Cox blocked 2 shots.

The Blue Jays had 4 steals but the Ringnecks stole the ball 13 times. Porter, Schrum, Cox and Jordan Karnopp each had 1 theft to their credit.

Norton had 24 turnovers while Hill City lost the ball just 6 times.

Junior varsity

Norton lost the junior varsity contest by a score of 40-33.

Norton led 11-9 after one quarter but Hill City was on top 19-17 at halftime. The Ringnecks scored 16 points in the third period compared to 10 for the Blue Jays to extend their lead to 35-27.

Norton outscored Hill City 6-5 in the low scoring fourth quarter.

Leading scorer for Norton was Kobie Unterscher with 10 points, followed by Jordan Karnopp, 7; Landon Porter, 5; Breven Sondergaard, 4; Tyus Henson, 4; Connor Griffey, 2; Derick Campbell, 1.

Leading the scoring for Hill City was Zech Wilson with 17 points.


Next action
