The Norton Community High School varsity wrestling team entered 10 wrestlers in the always tough Panther Classic in Phillipsburg on Saturday but only eight finished competition and the Blue Jays placed fourth.

Phillipsburg won the team title with 126.5 points, followed by Hoisington, 123; Marysville, 112.5; Norton, 103; Abilene, 99; Beloit, 90; Oakley, 58.5; Minneapolis, 55; Lincoln, 50.5; Ellsworth, 49; Ellis, 32; Hoxie, 25.5; St. Francis, 25; Thomas More Prep-Hays, 17; Hill City, 10; Stockton, 2.

Alec Hager at 138 was Norton's only champion. Because of his good day, which included defeating a previously unbeaten wrestler in the finals, Alec was named "Norton Wrestler of the Week" by the Blue Jay coaches.

Wrestling for championships and placing runner-up were Caysean Campbell, 106; Branson Addington, 113 and Jared Tallent, 145.

Placing fourth were Cole Renner, 170 and Kolton Harting, 195.


Norton was open at 120, 132, 182 and 220.

Also wrestling for Norton were Trenton Wright, 126; Gavin Lively, 152; Kendall Miller, 160 and Michael Johnson, 285.

Lively won one match and lost one, then withdrew due to injury. Miller won one match before withdrawing due to illness.

"We knew we would be more shorthanded than normal, mainly due to injury, but as the day went on, it was apparent it would be even worse," said Norton head coach Bill Johnson. "Miller was out due to illness after winning one match and Lively wrestled a couple of matches before withdrawing due to an injury. Caysean Campbell placed second in a hard fought, well-wrestled match but received a rib injury in the closing seconds.

"I'm not happy with our performance but, when you look at the team scores, we weren't that far out of first place. In this tournament, year in and year out, we have had several wrestlers out of the lineup due to injury. You can't control injuries or sickness.

"All of our injuries are frustrating to both our coaching staff and our wrestlers. It's hard to get momentum rolling. In the end, you just put your healthiest weestlers on the mat and pray for good things."

Norton had a 15-12 won-loss record and a 7-3 pin ratio in the tournament.
