Junior varsity wins Phillipsburg tourney

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Although team scores were not officially announced, Norton junior varsity wrestlers earned more points than any other team in the Panther Classic JV Tournament held Saturday, Feb. 8 in conjunction with the varsity Panther Classic in Phillipsburg.

Norton scored 160 points, followed by Abilene, 141.5; Beloit, 74.5; Hoisington, 69; Marysville, 67; Phillipsburg, 52; Ellsworth, 45; Stockton, 42; Minneapolis, 38; Oakley, 32; Hill City, 15.5; St. Francis, 14; Ellis, 5; Lincoln, 3; Hoxie, 0;

Norton entered eleven wrestlers and nine of them placed in the top two of their weight class, five being champions.

Winning gold medals were Skylar Johnson, 106; Kyle Bell, 120; Derek Rowh, 138; Mike Kasson, 152 and Jordan Dole,

Finishing runner-up were Kade Unterseher, 113; Dalton Vanover, 138; Garret Otter, 145 and Maverick Engel, 170.

Also wrestling for Norton were Lavton Miller and Alex Hjort, 182.

Norton had an outstanding 24-9 won-loss record and excellent 17-5 pin ratio.

"I was very proud of our performance," said Norton assistant coach Shane Miller. "I think this is a testament to the type of schedule we keep with our junior varsity team. Most JV teams do not get as much competition as what our wrestlers do and it showed today. You could definitely tell our preparation is above the others. Official team scores were not kept but unofficially we would have finished

ahead of everyone else.

"I like to see how we match up with other junior varsity squads in the area. There are some traditionally good teams that attend the Panther Classic and we proved today that we have some good young wrestlers."

The Norton coaches named Jordan Dole as the "Norton JV Wrestler of the Week".

"Jordan continues to show improvement and gain confidence," said coach Miller. "He had three falls and a tech fall on his way to a first place finish."

Norton Blue Jays come up short against Oberlin

Just as they were when they lost a weather-delayed contest to Colby by a score of 64-59 on Monday in Norton, the Blue Jays were in the game all the way and had the score tied at 27-all after three quarters.

Norton led 10-8 after one period on the strength of threepoint baskets by Tyus Henson and Drew Schrum. The Blue Jays' worst quarter was the second when they scored just 7 points and Oberlin put in 11 to lead 19-17 at halftime.

The Blue Jays outscored the Red Devils 10-8 in the third quarter to tie the score.

With 4:40 left in the game, Oberlin scored to take a 36-30 lead. Ouinton Porter scored. was fouled in the act and hit the

free throw for three points to cut the Red Devil advantage to 36-33. Two free throws by Conor Cox cut it to 36-35.

Oberlin free throws at the 3:02 mark made it 38-35 but Schrum scored for Norton and it was back to a one-point Oberlin lead at 38-37.

Norton began fouling in an attempt to get the ball back but the Red Devils hit 7 free throws to stretch their lead to 45-37.

Landon Porter was inserted into the Norton lineup and drained a three-point basket to make it 45-40 and Oberlin added one final free throw before the gun.

"We really struggled in the first half against their press plus we had some injury and foul problems but with all that we were still in the game," said Norton head coach Doug Re-

As a team, Norton hit just 3 of 18 from beyond the arc for 17 percent, 10 of 35 two-point tries for 29 percent and 13 of 53 overall for 25 percent.

In contrast, Oberlin swished just 2 of 9 from long range for 22 percent, 14 of 32 two-point tries for 44 percent and 16 of 41 overall for 39 percent.

From the free throw line, the Blue Jays hit an outstanding 11 of 15 for 73 percent. The Red Devils hit 12 of 21 charities for 57 percent.

The Norton Community High School varsity wrestling team will compete in the Class 3-2-1A Regional Wrestling Tournament this Friday and Saturday in WaKeeney.

Four of the top 10 ranked teams in the state will be among the 24 teams competing. They are Norton, No.1; Phillipsburg, No.7; Oberlin, No. 8 and Smith Center, No.10. Other teams competing will
