RESOLUTION NO. 2014 - 09 A RESOLUTION INDICATING THE INTENT OF THE GOVERNING BODY

OF NORTON COUNTY, KANSAS, TO ENTER INTO A LEASE-PURCHASE AGREEMENT IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF NOT TO EX-CEED THREE HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$365,000) FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS TO REFINANCE AN IS-SUE ORIGINALLY ISSUED TO ACQUIRE, PURCHASE AND EQUIP AN EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES BUILDINGS; AND AUTHORIZING THE OFFERING FOR SALE OF CERTIFICATES OF PARTICIPATION IN SUCH LEASE PURCHASE AGREEMENT.

WHEREAS, under the Constitution and statues of the State of Kansas, particularly K.S.A. 10-1116b and 10-1116c (the "Act"), Norton County, Kansas (the "County") is empowered to enter into leases and lease-purchase agreements for the lease and acquisition of real and personal property upon such terms and conditions as deemed necessary by the governing body of the County; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the County has previously found it necessary and desirable to acquire, purchase and equip an emergency medical services building located in the County (the "Project") to further its governmental and public purposes; and

WHEREAS, the County has previously issued Certificates of Participation, Series 2009 (the "2009 Certificates") for the purpose of acquiring, purchasing and equipping the Project; and WHEREAS, in order to achieve interest cost savings, and to accomplish a com-

prehensive and orderly plan of refinancing it is necessary and desirable to provide for the refunding and early redemption of the outstanding 2009 Certificates; and WHEREAS, in order to provide for the refinancing of the Project, the governing body of the County finds it necessary and desirable to enter into a new Lease Purchase Agreement (the "Lease") and to offer and sell certificates of participation in

the Lease (the "2014 Certificates"), which evidence proportionate interests in and rights to receive payments under the Lease, all pursuant to the authority provided by Kansas Law, including the Act; and WHEREAS, the County has selected Central States Capital Markets, LLC, Wichita, Kansas (the "Underwriter") as underwriter of the 2014 Certificates repre-

senting the interest in the Lease; and WHEREAS, the Lease involves the acquisition of land and buildings and is for a term exceeding the current fiscal year, and provides for rental payments which in the aggregate exceed \$100,000.

### NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE **GOVERNING BODY OF NORTON COUNTY, KANSAS:**

SECTION 1. The County intends and is hereby authorized to refinance the Project (as defined above) in an amount which will not exceed the cost of \$365,000 in aggregate principal amount, subject in all respects to the negotiation of satisfactory lease-purchase arrangements for the Project. The total of all payments to be made pursuant to the Lease is estimated to be \$435,000 for the purpose of refinancing the 2009 Certificates (as defined above) originally issued to acquire, construct and install the Project.

SECTION 2. The Underwriter (as defined above) is authorized and directed to prepare and distribute the Preliminary Official Statement, in cooperation with Triplett, Woolf & Garretson, LLC, as Special Counsel. The Chairman and County Clerk are authorized to execute the Preliminary Official Statement. The Preliminary Official Statement is authorized to be distributed (in its entirety) to prospective purchasers.

SECTION 3. Before the County enters into the Lease and before any Certificates are issued, this Resolution shall be published once a week for two (2) consecutive weeks in The Norton Telegram, a newspaper of general circulation within Norton County, Kansas and if within thirty (30) days after last date of publication of this Resolution, a petition in opposition to this Resolution signed by not less than 5% of the qualified voters of the County is filed with the County Election Officer, the Board of County Commissioners shall submit the question to the voters at an election called for that purpose or at the next general election before entering into the Lease or issuing the Certificates. If no sufficient protest is filed with the County Election Officer within the period of time hereinbefore stated, then the Commission shall be authorized to enter into the Lease and proceed to issue the Certificates to pay the costs of the Project.

SECTION 4. This Resolution shall become effective upon its approval and passage by a majority vote of the governing body of Norton County, Kansas.
