Huskies, Trojan competed in All-Star game

nortontelegram@nwkansas The 29th annual 8-Man All-Star Football Games were held on Saturday in Beloit and three local area players were participants in one of the games.

Playing for the West team in the Division II game were Jordan Baird, 5'11', 175 pound running back for Northern Valley; Ian Vincent, 6', 220 pound offensive guard for Northern Valley and Brett Pinkerton, 5'10", 160 pound defensive back from Logan.

An assistant coach for the Division II West squad was Chuck Fessenden, longtime head foot-

ball coach at Northern Valley. Although both the West and East teams spent most of the time passing, on his few runs, Baird proved to be the rugged, hard-running back that he has always been for the Huskies. Baird also caught a pass for a 14-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter and had 6 total receptions for 59 yards in the game.

Vincent played the whole game on offense for the West and spent most of his time pass blocking.

Pinkerton also played the entire contest as a defensive back and made his share of tackles as he was kept busy by the on-

slaught of passes from the East quarterbacks.

With both teams filling the airways, the West held a slim 15-14 lead after one quarter but the East led by 22-21 at halftime. Both teams scored 8 points in the third period as the East held a 30-29 advantage with one period remaining.

The fireworks really increased in the final stanza with the East scoring 22 points and the West tallying 12 as the East prevailed 52-41 for a total of 93 points!

The East completed 25 of 39 passes with none intercepted for 306 yards. The West passing total was 421 yards on 25 of 46 with 2 interceptions.

The East gained 73 yards on the ground for 379 total yards and the West gained 65 rushing yards for total offense of 486 yards.

A defensive gem by end Dustin Davidson of Hope on the first play of the fourth quarter gave the East an advantage that they didn't give up. With the West driving for a possible lead, Davidson anticipated a West screen pass by quarterback Kyle Gfeller of Sharon Springs. He intercepted the pass and returned it 35 yards for a touchdown.

East quarterback Dustin Rottinghaus of state champion Baileyville B&B ran in the two extra points, giving the East a 38-29 advantage.

The West answered with a 29-yard touchdown pass from Gfeller to Ty Clark of Fowler but Rottinghaus passed for two more touchdowns to put the game out of reach for the West by the time Baird ran into the end zone with only 2:49 remaining in the game.

Rottinghaus finished with 297 passing yards on 24 of 36 and an all-star game record six touchdowns and Gfeller completed 25 of 45 with 2 interceptions for 421 yards and passed for five touchdowns.

The Division I game was played first and did not feature

as much offense as was seen in the second contest. Both teams had more rushing than passing vards as the East edged the West 20-16.

Among the East players were three from the state champions: Kenton Ubelaker, Osborne running back; Maverick LeRock, Osborne running back and Collin Berkley, Osborne lineman.

Players for the West team included Dylan Tiemeyer, Atwood defensive back; Cameron Ginther, Atwood lineman; Chase Kennedy, Hoxie quarterback and Mitchel Johnson, Hoxie lineman.

"We are excited to have John on board," added Bethany head track and field coach Ken Ciolek. "I am looking forward to seeing how he develops at Bethany College."


John is the son of Cheri and Craig Renner. He has a 3.0 grade point average and plans to major in sports management.
