### **Board appoints new president for 2014-15**

The U.S.D. 211 Board of Education elected a new president and vicepresident at its Monday meeting. Robert Wyatt was appointed to serve as president of the board for the 2014-15 school year, by a vote of 5-1. Wyatt abstained from the vote. Bill Jones was appointed to serve as vice-president.

Also, Wyatt was appointed as Curriculum Coordinating Council and as the board's representative on the Kansas Association of School Boards Governmental Relations Board.

Other appointments include April Karnopp as the board's representative to the North Central Kansas Special Education Cooperative Board of Directors, and Craig Renner as the board's representative on the

Superintendent Greg Mann presented the board with the proposed 2014-15 budget. Following a discussion the board approved the budget for publication with a capital outlay mill levy of 5.5 mills and a Local Option Budget of \$1.74 million, by a 5-1 vote. Steve Berry voted no. The board will hold its budget hearing at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, Aug. 11, in the U.S.D. 211 board room.
