Winning pitcher was Clint Cole who gave up 10 hits, walked 2 and struck out 2 batters.

The Norton players and coaches were especially happy with the come-from-behind victory to start the tournament. "We were down 4-0 and never gave up," said Norton catcher Jacob Green.

"Clint Cole pitched a nice game after settling down, " said

third baseman Lane Bigge.

"The first three innings we hit the ball right at them but after that we found some holes in their defense," said designated hitter Dalton Miller.

The game ended with Hager running down and tagging out an Oakley player who was caught off first base by a throw from pitcher Cole.


