Board members go to last meeting

Two board members attended their last meeting at the special St. Francis Board of Education meeting early Tuesday, June 30.

Both Pete Raile and Bruce Feikert were presented plaques by Bonnie Zwegardt, president. The board members had served on the board 16 years. Filling their seats are Ed Marin and Derrick Tice.

Superintendent Rob Schiltz said, just as last year, Kansas schools will not receive from the state the final payments of state aid for the month of June until sometime in July. The law requires that these July payments be recorded as June receipts.

Mr. Schiltz recommended and the board approved that \$363,785 be transferred from the general fund to various funds including: Special Education, Vocational Education, Driver Education, Food Service, Contingency Reserve, Professional Development

and At Risk.

Mr. Schiltz reported on the various projects that are in progress, including the new windows at the high school, suspended ceilings and new lighting in the high school hallways, remodeling of the grade school computer lab and the grade school girls' restroom.

The board received and read a thank-you note from a graduating senior expressing appreciation

for the scholarship he had earned.

Six additional non-licensed employee contracts had been signed and returned.

Testing the soil improves profit

During 2008, Kansas residents sent more than 80,000 soil samples to labs - including 15,000 to the K-State lab - for testing. After receiving test results, the local extension agent makes recommendations, since applying too much or too little fertilizer can reduce profits.

For example, assume that soil test recommendations for nitrogen are 10 pounds per acre lower than

what the producer would normally apply for a particular yield. If nitrogen is 50 cents per pound, saving 10 pounds per acre by using soil test recommendations reduces costs by \$5 per acre and reduces a potential hazard to the environment from applying too much fertilizer.
