Doctor will be guest speaker at meeting

Dr. James Reeves, podiatrist for the Cheyenne County Hospital through the specialty clinic, will be the guest speaker at the upcoming diabetes support group meeting on Wednesday, Sept. 16. The meeting will be held at 1:30 p.m. in the Cheyenne County Clinic's basement conference room. Friends and family are also encouraged to attend the support group.

Leg and foot problems are the most common reasons for diabetes-related hospitalization. Diabetes is the leading cause for amputation in the lower leg and foot.

Regular examinations and vascular testing are important to help di-

agnose inadequate blood flow in the legs and feet.

Dr. Reeves will discuss the importance of medical care to the foot, ankle and lower leg. He will also discuss diabetic neuropathy, a condition in which nerve function deteriorates in the body's extremities, leads to a gradual loss of feeling in the hands, arms, legs and feet.
