




On behalf of Prairie Land Electric Coop Inc. I want to thank the members for the hospitality shown to our employees during the recent ice storm. We also would like to thank all the farmers for the use of their tractors in getting our trucks to areas unreachable without their help. The employees really appreciated everything that was done for them and the patience shown during this difficult time.

As of Jan. 16th, our best estimate of poles that went down in the ice storm is 1850. The storm hit Dec. 30th, 2006 and we were able to restore everyone's power by Jan. 12, 2007 (14 days later). We had 182 linemen and 7 inside help working on our system at one time restoration period. They are as follows:

Brown Atchison - Horton, KS - 3 Linemen
