



The employees really appreciated everything that was done for them and the patience shown during this difficult time.

As of Jan. 16th, our best estimate of poles that went down in the ice storm is 1850. The storm hit Dec. 30th, 2006 and we were able to restore everyone's power by Jan. 12, 2007 (14 days later). 


