## Indians play strong teams before holiday

St. Francis met two strong basketball teams the week of Dec. 18, just prior to Christmas break.

On Tuesday night the Indians traveled to Atwood to meet the Rawlins County Buffs, the team which won the Sagebrush Shoot-out. Saintry fell to Rawlins County 56-48.

Thursday the Colby Eagles handed the Indians a 76-50 loss in Colby.

The next competition will take place Friday, Jan. 4, in St. Francis with the Hoxie Indians.

Rawlins County/Atwood continued their December winning streak, defeating the Indians 56-48 in Atwood.

Ted Crabtree paced the Saintry with 14 points and had 11 rebounds, 10 of them defensive.

"Atwood was undefeated and beat Brewster by 20 points last Saturday," Coach Ward Cassidy said.

"We had a chance at the end to get them. We just kept working and got them down to a four-point lead with two minutes left and then we just didn't execute.

"Atwood has two good guards and they made 10 three-point shots despite our efforts to get out on them."

Rawlins County was particularly hot early in the game with 22 points in the first quarter.

Saintry was 4-of-15 from three point range but had a better shooting percentage from the two-point

area. There they were 50 percent making 14-of-28 attempts. At the line they were 8-of-15 for 53.3 percent. Hitting the four three's were Matt Raile with two and Crabtree and Keaton Frewen with one each.

Of the players with more than three attempts from the two-point area, Trent Kinen had the best percentage with 4-of-6 for 66.7 percent.

The team had five blocked shots with Crabtree having three. He also led in assists with four.

"We are still learning to play together but I am very proud of the effort given by all the guys," Coach Cassidy said.

Crabtree scored 18 points in this contest followed by M. Raile with 10. Crabtree also led the Indians in rebounds with 10.

"Colby again has an excellent team with lots of depth and talent," Coach Cassidy said. "We played hard throughout the game and all the guys showed improvement.

"We will improve over break and we are all looking forward to getting better."

The shooting percentage from three-point range was better in this game as they hit 3-of-7 for about 43 percent. M. Raile hit two of his four attempts.
