January is Cervical Health Awareness Month

Cervical cancer was the number one cancer killer of women, but during the past 50 years in the U.S. the number of new cases and deaths has declined 75 percent. This is largely because of the widely available reliable Pap test.

An estimated 4,210 women died from cervical cancer in the U.S. last year. In Kansas women, cervical cancer accounts for approximately 2 percent of all cancer, with an average of 107 new cases diagnosed each year. About 33 Kansas women die of cervical cancer annually.

Pap smears should be given yearly starting three years after a woman becomes sexually active, or no later than 21 years of age. The tests can be given every two years if a liquid-based kit is used, and the frequency of testing can be reduced to every 2 to 3 years in women aged 30 years and older if they have had three normal tests in a row.
