



They hide mostly in or near beds, so if a person is suspicious that there might be bed bugs present, start looking at the mattress, bed frame and headboard. They are difficult to see unless the bed is dismantled and a flashlight is

Adults and nymphs can be seen with the naked eye, but eggs require magnification. They also hide in other furniture, loose wallpaper, in cracks and crevices along floorboards and under the edge of carpeting, switch plates and outlets. They even have been found inside phones, clocks and smoke detectors.

Supervisor Lohr said preventing bed bug infestations is difficult because they can be transported by luggage, clothing, bedding or furniture. Travelers, he said, can help prevent distribution of bed bugs by inspecting bedding along the seams of mattresses and box springs for the sign of bugs. Also keep the luggage elevated.
