## Girl Scouts have successful sales

Girl Scouts of Kansas Heartland had another successful cookie sale. Members of the 80 Kansas counties in the Heartland district wish to show their appreciation to members of the communities.

The St. Francis Girl Scouts sold a total of 3,228 boxes with 19 of the 22 girls selling. This comes out to 169 boxes per girl an increase of 21.7 percent from 2010.

Girl Scouts across the 80 counties sold nearly 1.5 million boxes, a 7.6 percent increase over last year. The 2011 sale took place from Jan. 22 through March 13.

The cookie sale numbers include: 1,496,500 total boxes sold 9,165 total Girl Scouts participated; 15,328 boxes were collected for the Cookie Share program, up 48 percent from last year. These cookies will be distributed to the Kansas Food Bank, Catholic Charities, McConnell Air Force Base, the Kansas National Guard and local food pantries.

"When you pull a box of Thin Mints out of your freezer this summer (if you have any left) think about all of the Girl Scouts who are enjoying wonderful summer camp experiences all because of you," said Shelly Chenoweth, Girl Scouts of Kansas Heartland chief executive officer. "Girls are learning new skills, developing confidence and becoming leaders because of your support."

Eight varieties of Girl Scout cookies were available including Thin Mints, Shortbread, Peanut Butter Patties, Peanut Butter Sandwiches, Lemonades, Caramel deLites, Thanks-A-Lot and Shout Outs. Proceeds from the cookie sale are used to benefit local girls, helping them pay for summer camp experiences, purchase uniforms and much more. The sale also funds programs and services throughout the year and ensures that Girl Scouting will be available in the future.

For more than 90 years the Girl Scout Cookie Program has helped girls foster a sense of personal and collective empowerment by promoting skills they will use throughout their lives. Through this annual activity, girls ages, 5 to 17, learn how to set goals develop action plans, work as a team and cultivate a sense of business ethics...and most of all, have fun!
