# Meeting attended for rural health

Around 40 people met at the Bird City Legion Hall on Thursday for the second Rural Health Works meeting with Dr. John Leatherman. The noon meal was provided by Rod Young, Bressler-Young Aviation. After reviewing the results of the last meeting's public input, he talked about the telephone survey to find the public's need of health care in Cheyenne County which will be conducted starting Tuesday, May 31. The results of this survey will help identify the community's health and eldercare needs.

The survey is being made by Fort Hays State University Docking Institute. There will be random calls made in the county until there are 200 responses.

Mr. Leatherman said he hoped there would be a good representation of the different areas in the county along with a variety of ages and gender.

The caller will start out by telling the person answering the phone that they are from Fort Hays State University, then explaining the reason for the call. Some of the questions will be chosen or written during the next meeting on May 26.

People, Dr. Leatherman said, are asked not to hang up on these callers. Their responses are important to getting information for the survey.

The survey will be made between the hours of 6 and 9 p.m. and will last only 10 minutes. The questions will be simple and

will generally require only a yes or no response.

People attending the meeting were asked what questions they thought should be on the survey list. Some of the questions, they thought, should deal with long-term health care, assistant living facility, the county subsidizing long-term health care, support for the hospital, private or county ownership of the long-term care facility, emergency medical service, transportation challenges to health care facilities and educating the people on better health. Other comments included the need for a wellness/exercise center as well as an indoor swimming pool.

Those volunteering to serve on the committee to set up ways of letting the public know about the upcoming survey were Chuck Kribs, Rod Klepper, Rita Stephens, Cynthia Poling and Linda Rogers.

### Next meeting

The next meeting will be held at noon on Thursday, May 26, at Riverside Recreation.
