### Village Update

I would again like to thank everybody who has been supportive of the Village from the day of the fire until now. We were out of operation from Oct. 19 until March 14. As most of you know, for those 5 months staff and residents were scattered. We are now regrouped with 22 residents and 40 staff with the completion of Phase I of the recovery. This brings us to the next step, Phase II.

The planning work of Phase II is in motion. Many of you have noticed that the blue tarps are still up on the south roof, and that the burned center section of the building has not had any work going on, thinking nothing is happening. In fact, the Society is working with a long-term care engineering and design firm which has submitted architectural drawings to the State of Kansas for approval of the modified reconstruction of the center section. The plans include the addition of three private rooms at the west side, and three offices at the east side, with a connecting

When the connecting corridor is re-established, residents will again have wheel chair access to the main dining room and the acdesign is expected within two or subject to voter approval.

three weeks, at which time the demolition of the center section will begin. In preparation for that, the center section has been gutted including the removal of the old asbestos floor tile. Of the existing structure, only the north wall will be left standing. The timeline calls for the center section to be completed in September-October. Then the temporary dining rooms, activities room, and therapy room in the west wing will be re-converted to resident semi-private rooms, opening up ten beds. With the three added private rooms, our bed capacity will be at 35. Before the fire, we had 50 beds. At 35 beds the Village should again be a financially self-sustaining opera-

In consideration of the upcoming vote on county ownership of the Village, I would like to point out that of the five Good Samaritan facilities in Northwest Kansas, St. Francis is the only one which is not county-owned. The facilities in Atwood, Oberlin, Goodland, and Sharon Springs are countyowned with the Good Samaritan Society as the contracted operator. This is the same arrangement that the Society is putting before the tivities lounge. Approval on the Cheyenne County Commission,

There will be a lot of information and pro and con discussion in the coming weeks about this vote--what direction is best for the community, how much of an investment are taxpayers prepared to make, etc. At 35 beds, the Village should not require much taxpayer support, especially if the Village and Cheyenne County Hospital are considered jointly in terms of county financing. If the question of construction at the Village--to add assisted living units, or more private rooms, or an Alzheimer's Unit--is on the table, that is a whole other discussion in terms of taxpayer financing and the long-term economic viability

of Cheyenne County. In short, we as a community are at a crossroads. I recognize Tom Keller and the Community Builders for their commitment and involvement to promote the best interests of Cheyenne County, and to Cheyenne County Hospital Administrator Les Lacy for inviting the Kansas Rural Health Works Program to get involved in the planning process.
