## Ordinance published to raise reconnect fee

ORDINANCE NO. 575

AN ORDINANCE INCREASING THE RECONNECTION CHARGE IN THE EVENT OF DISCONNECTION OF CITY UTILITY SERVICES AND AMENDING SECTION 215 OF CHAPTER 15 OF THE 2003 CODE OF THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS, that Section 15-215 of the 2003 Code of the City of St. Francis, Kansas, shall be amended to read as follows:

15-215. DISCONNECTION, RECONNECTION CHARGE. The governing body shall establish, by ordinance, a utility service disconnection and reconnection charge. Whenever the city receives a request from a customer for termination of utility service the disconnection charge shall be added to the customer's final bill. Any service disconnected for nonpayment of delinquent bill shall be reconnected only upon payment of the delinquent bill, interest penalty thereon, and the reconnection charge. The reconnection fee shall be \$50 plus tax

This Section 15-215, as amended, shall take effect and be enforced from and after its publication in the official city newspaper, The St. Francis Herald.

## Resolution published to hold special election

Published in The Saint Francis Herald, St. Francis, Kansas, and the Bird City Times, Bird City, Kansas, Thursday, May 19, 2011.

RESOLUTION 11-06

A resolution authorizing a special election for issuance of additional tax levies on all taxable tangible property for a home for the aged pursuant to K.S.A. 19-2106, 19-2106b and 19-2106e and amendments thereto.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Cheyenne County, Kansas, determined that in order to maintain a home for the aged it is necessary to make an annual tax levy; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Cheyenne County, Kansas, determined that the annual tax levy will not exceed six (6) mills; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Cheyenne County, Kansas, determined that a special election is necessary to submit the question of making such tax levies to the voters; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Cheyenne County Commissioners:

The question of whether or not to make an annual tax levy for the purpose of creating a special fund to be used in acquiring a site for the building of a home or homes, for the enlargement of or addition to the home already established and for the equipping, repairing, remodeling and furnishing a such home or homes, enlargements, or additions or for any one or more of such purposes shall be submitted to the voters of Cheyenne County, Kansas. A home for the aged means personal care homes, boarding homes and nursing homes.

The Board of County Commissioners hereby declares that the question to be submitted to the voters shall be as follows, to-wit:

Shall the county of Cheyenne County, Kansas, levy a tax not to exceed six (6) mills for a home for the aged? Yes  No   
To vote for the proposition place an "x" in the square following "yes". To vote against the proposition place and "x" in the square following "no."
