

Born in the basement of the familv home on Jan. 17, 1940, to Melvin Willard Carman and Winnifred May (Edmonds) Carman. Stan grew up in the South Fork area of Cheyenne County. Throughout his youth, he worked in his father's dairy and on the family farm. He attended the Broadview one-room schoolhouse before moving on to the St. Francis Community High School (1954-1958), where he played football and ran track and was vice president of FFA. He wrestled all four years and in his senior year he placed third at the Wrestling State competition. In January 2011, Stan felt honored to attend a Wrestling Homecoming Ceremony for all the St. Francis wrestlers who had placed at state between 1934 and 2010.

After graduation, he enlisted in the United States Air Force in June 1958. While stationed at Chanute Air Force Base in Illinois, he received training in electronics, aerodynamics and instrument navigation of airplanes and was then an instructor in instrument training. He continued his work as an instructor while stationed at Sondrestrom Air Force Base in Greenland. He attained the rank of Airman First Class and was honorably discharged in January 1962.

One of the most important events of his life followed his return to St. Francis to work on the family farm. Stan met Janet Jo Evins, daughter of Calvert Lewis and Janetta Flo (Waters) Evins. On Dec. 13, 1964, they were married at the Methodist Church in St. Francis


