Depending on how well students perform individually on the Kansas assessment, they are classified into one of five categories: 1) Academic warning; 2) approaches standard; 3) meets standard; 4) exceeds standard; and 5) exemplary.

The sophomores was tested in math and reading this year. The state of Kansas goal for math was to have 82.3 percent of students score meets standard or above. This year's sophomores were 88 percent meets standard

The Kansas goal for reading was to have 86 percent of students score meets standard or above and 92 percent of the sophomores scored meets standard or above on the Kansas Reading assessment this year. Mr. Schiltz commended the class as well as Devin Dinkel and David Morrow, teachers.

The juniors were tested in science this year and 96 percent scored meets standard or above. Mr. Schiltz recognized both the junior class and their teacher, Jeff Olofson for an outstanding job on the science assessment.
