



Beware of Heat Exhaustion

Heat exhaustion is a milder form of heat-related illness that can develop after several days of exposure to high temperatures and inadequate or unbalanced replacement of fluids. Those most prone to heat exhaustion are elderly people, people with high blood pressure, obese people, and people working or exercising in a hot environment.

Warning signs of heat exhaustion include: heavy sweating, paleness, muscle cramps, tiredness, weakness, dizziness, headache, nausea or vomiting, fainting. The skin may be cool and moist. The victim's pulse rate will be fast and weak, and be outdoors, wear a light weighted, cal provider whether the medica-

victim has heart problems or high blood pressure. Otherwise, help the victim to cool off, and seek medical attention if symptoms worsen or last longer than 1 hour.

Here are some cooling measures and precautions to prevent heat exhaustion and other heat-related illnesses. When temperatures climb, remember to wear loose fitting, light weight, light-colored clothing: Excess dark or tight clothing holds in heat and doesn't let your body cool properly as it inhibits sweat evaporation.




