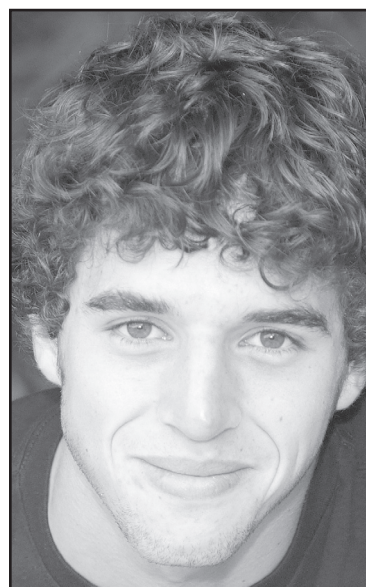
## Runner invited to Shrine Bowl 2-mile all-star run
