# Run/walk scheduled for Saturday of the county fair

The St. Francis United Methodist Church and the St. Francis Recreation Commission will sponsor a 5K run and a 2 mile non-competitive walk on Saturday, Aug. 6, starting at the St. Francis Community High School at 100 S. College Street. There is a registration fee. Registration forms may be picked up at the United Methodist Church education building on Webster Street, at the St. Francis City Office, or e-mail warrencico@yahoo.com or call (785) 772-7098.

Awards will be given to the overall male and female winner in the 5K run and medals will be given for first through third place in each age group. Age groups will be as follows: 14-and-under, 15-19, 20-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59 and 60 plus. The first 15 walkers to register will receive a medal.

T-shirts will be given out while supply lasts...so be sure to register early.

The course will be a hilly course heading north from the high school, then east, south, west and then finish on College Street at the Washington Street intersection. There will be water stations along the way.

The walk route will go south from the school, go west, north, and then east back to the school. There will also be water stations for the walkers.

After the race there will be refreshments for the participants and door prizes. If any local

The book, "Heaven is for Real," was recommended to me. After buying a copy, I had to wait for Lezlie and Lexi to get through it. When my chance came I found the story to be quick but very powerful. The setting for the story is close to home. It tells of a family from Imperial, Neb., about two hours drive from our corner of Kansas. Familiar towns like McCook and Benkelman are also featured. The true story is told by the father, Todd Burpo (and co-written with Lynn Vincent,) and focuses on his young

son, Colton. The boy, after becoming seriously ill from a ruptured appendix, experienced what some would call a "near death experience." After recovering from surgery, Colton shares bits and pieces of what he saw during his brush with the afterlife. As the title of the book says, the boy has no doubt that Heaven indeed is for real. It's an easy book to find and well worth your time to read and share.
