Student attends Shrine Bowl again

Logan Whitmore of St. Francis is making a return trip to the Shrine Bowl this year as a member of the Kansas All-State Marching Band.

It will be business as usual when dozens of the state's best bandmen gather this week to prepare for the 2011 Kansas Shrine Bowl in Hays. That, and plenty of water to combat the heat wave that's gripping much of the country.

The band, now in its 28th year, has become a staple of the Kansas Shrine Bowl, dating back to the 80s when the band was formed in order to provide music for the annual all-star football game. This year, 170 band members from all over the state will gather to learn music and marching, and create lasting friendships.

This year's band will be one of the smallest in years, according to Kansas Masonic Foundation spokesman Gary Van Cleave. "But we have kids coming from St. Francis in the northwest corner, Riverton in the southeast corner, Hiawatha up in the northeast, Johnson in the southwest, and all points in between."

With only a few days to practice, Van Cleave says it's amazing how much band members learn in such

a short time. "When they come together and do this in two or three days, it's awe-inspiring."

The band not only has a rigorous practice schedule, but is called upon to perform four times in a 24-hour span, including the annual Shrine Bowl banquet on Friday night, leading the Shrine Bowl parade on Saturday morning, and presenting pre-game and half-time shows during the game itself.

This year's band will be directed by Lane Weaver, director of athletic bands at Ft. Hays State University. He'll be assisted by members of the Fort Hays State music staff.

Bandsmen were scheduled to report on Tuesday morning with the first practice set for that afternoon.

Whitmore has represented St. Francis well during his high school career as he goes into his senior year. Some of his other honors include Kansas All-State John Philip Sousa Honor Band, two years; K-State Concert Band Clinic Honor Band, three years; Western Plains Music Festival Honor Band, three years; Northwest District Kansas Music Educators Association Honor Jazz Band, two years; Northwest

District Kansas Music Educators Association Honor Band, two years; Kansas Music Educators Association All-State Honor Band (first St. Francis student to qualify for all-state); Kansas Lions Band, two years; High Plains Band and Orchestra Camp Honor Band and High Plains Band and Orchestra Camp Jazz Band.

Logan has also received the Outstanding High School Music Student Award, two years and has

had I Ratings on trumpet solos at regional and state music festivals, three years.
