Once the county fair is over, it is time to start thinking about the beginning of school.

St. Francis students will enroll from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Wednesday and Thursday. All grades will be enrolling in the high school cafeteria with the elementary enrollment being held on one side and the junior-senior high enrollment on the other side. Parents should be prepared to pay fees for book rental and activity ticket(s). Lunch tickets, towel fees and yearbook purchase may also be paid at this time. All students and their parents will be required to sign an internet user policy. Abuse of the school internet will result in students' not being allowed access.

The first day of school is Monday, Aug. 29. The day will be a full day of school starting at 8:35 a.m. Lunch will be served. There will be a kindergarten parent meeting from 8:35 to 9:35 a.m. and kindergarteners will go home with their parents. At 6:30 p.m. on Monday, Aug. 29, the PTA will hold "Meet-the-Teacher Night" at the grade school. Junior and senior high school football and volleyball practice will begin on Monday, Aug. 15. The open house is set for 7 p.m. on Friday, Aug. 26. The first varsity volleyball game will be held at Hoxie on Tuesday, Aug. 30, with Golden Plains and St. Francis. The first varsity football game will be held on Friday, Sept. 2, at Colby.
